


This map shows the boundaries for persons living within the 48009 Zip-Code area. The new postal system goes into effect both locally and nationally July 1.

**Zip-Code number for this area is 48008.** The system is expected to speed up deliveries as much as 24 hours in many cases.



The people living within these boundaries will have 48010 as their Zip-Code number. The prefix 480 designates Birmingham and the 10 specifies the exact area.

to apply for the liquor license. The alley itself could be permitted under the present zoning with approval of the zoning board of appeals.  
A PUBLIC hearing was set for 8 p.m. Monday, July 15, on a petition by Metropolitan Federal Savings and Loan Association to rezone the southeast corner of 14 Mile and Southfield from residential to business and parking for the purpose of building a bank.  
Council President Marvin E. Cline suggested that some kind of statement be requested as to the ownership, worth and reputation of such organizations as the bank, before they be permitted to build. Councilman Chester A. Guilmet will present a report on the bank at the next regular council meeting.

## Land Purchase Is Step Toward Peripheral Route

City commissioners took another step in the construction of Birmingham's peripheral route Monday night.  
They adopted a resolution authorizing the purchase of the triangular-shaped parcel of property at the southeast corner of Woodward and Forest from the Masonic Temple Association. Total price of the land was \$41,500.  
The City was seeking the property to eliminate the jog where Woodward, Forest and Brown intersect. Brown will be part of the peripheral route taking traffic around the business district.  
INCLUDED IN the parcel purchased is a Pure Oil gas station on the corner. It will be torn down, according to City Manager L. R. Gare.  
The oil company and the Masonic Temple are negotiating the sale of the rest of the property for a new station fronting on Forest.  
This parcel would include the old Masonic Temple building which has been the Masonic Temple since 1925.
