Oakland Social Workers Laud Planner of Clinic

For her work with Planned Parenthood League, Mrs. Fraser Pomeroy of Robinhood Drive, Birmingham, has been named Volunteer of the Year by the Oakland County Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers.

A plaque was awarded to her at a recent dinner at Devon Gates, Bloomfield Hills.

It was through Mrs. Pomeroy's efforts that the new Planned Parenthood Clinic, established as a memorial to the late Elizabeth Duffield, was opened a few months ago at 212 Daines St. in Birmingham.

The clinic, in a converted house, replaces the four former clinics which were at inaccessible locations and could not service the patients efficiently.

MRS. POMEROY was a volunteer with Planned Parenthood only a year before Mrs. Mark Duffield's death, but was so impressed with her dedication to the cause for more than 15 years in this area that she worked out the memorial clinic idea.

With the help of Mrs. Glenn Wilson, she located the site and spent many days working out details and setting up the new clinic, all in the midst of the Christmas shopping push.

Mrs. Pomeroy is second vice chairman of the Planned Parenthood League and is assistant financial chairman. She also was co-chairman of the house tour held in the spring of 1962.

A VOLUNTEER in many other fields, Mrs. Pomeroy served on the Adams School PTA Board and the Birmingham Girl Scout Board and an organizational chairman in 1960, worked with the senior activity group at the Community House.

She was president of the United Church Women in Birmingham and served on the executive board, as president of the Woman's Union of the First Baptist Church for two years. She still serves on the executive boards of both groups.

For many years she has been a solicitor in the United Foundation and Community House drives and this year worked on the new member campaign for the Oakland YWCA.

With all her volunteer activities she still finds time to manage the Pomeroy household and keep up on the activities of her four children and four grandchildren.
