Hi-Y Clubs Ring Bells On July 4

Gov. George Romney has invited the Hi-Y Clubs of the state of Michigan to be coordinators for Michigan participation in the 4th of July "Let Freedom Ring!" national celebration.

It will be the responsibility of Hi-Y youth throughout the state to see that every possible bell in their respective communities is rung at 1 p.m. July 4.

DAVID DEKKER of Grand Rapids is the state chairman, with Elizabeth Davies of Alma as vice chairman. John Copeland, program director on the metropolitan staff of the Detroit "Y," is coordinator of the Detroit area observance.

Roger Blood, associate state YMCA executive, and George Trumbull, assistant press secretary to Gov. Romney, are advisors.

Gene Powers, member of the Edsel Ford Hi-Y Club of Dearborn, is youth chairman of the metropolitan Detroit area.

Ingram suggested that approval be delayed one week.

He said he had been "hot and cold" on the project and didn't want the request to be passed by a three-to-one margin if he votes no. Ingram said he knew the majority of the commission was in favor of the course.

UNDER THE proposed agreement, Matthews will supervise and oversee the construction of the course. He will provide detailed plans, specifications, working drawings and budgets necessary to implement the plan.

Birmingham will hire men and equipment as necessary to carry out the construction but they will report to Matthews. All the employees except Matthews will be employees of the City.

Construction of the course will get started as soon as the City is able to provide the labor and materials.

ALONG WITH the 3,200-yard course, facilities will be provided for a ski and sled run, picnic area, horseshoe courts, an ice rink and a club house.

The course, which will be about 500 yards longer overall than Springdale, will take up 57 acres at the site. Allowances have been made for the possible widening of Cranbrook and 14 Mile roads.

It is hoped the course will be ready for play in time for the 1964 golf season.

against residents and 15 per cent against the City.

SEWERS RANGING in size from 12 to 42 inches in diameter will be installed on Taunton, Croft, 14 Mile, Humphrey, Penitstone, Sheffield, Mehan and Mansfield.

The Oakland County Drain Commission has approved the plans and has submitted them to the state health department. The health department is expected to issue a permit within four to six weeks.

The assessor was also ordered to prepare the roll for the \$90,000 Cummings relief sewer. The city property owner share will be the same as on the St. Elton sewer.

The Cummings sewer will generally serve an area bounded by Woodward, Chapin, Grant and 14 Mile Road. The new sewers will range in size from 12 to 42 inches in diameter.

CITY ENGINEER William T. Killen said the sewer will be located in Bird from Woodward to Cummings and in Cummings from Chapin to 14 Mile Road.

New sewers will be constructed west from the Cummings sewer in Emmons, Davis, Smith, Bird and 14 Mile. New sewers will also be constructed in Davis and Smith from midway between Cummings and Woodward to Woodward.

Killen said his department expects to receive the necessary permits soon.

The third sewer project is the \$5,000 Ruffner Ave. relief sewer from Woodward 530 feet west. The purpose of the sewer is to relieve basement flooding in the area.

In order to get a better price for the Ruffner sewer it was included in the Cummings and St. Elton projects, Killen said. All necessary permits have been obtained.
