prohibited fraternity or sorority," he said.

HOLLINGSHEAD said it is essential that both parents and students recognize their responsibilities to determine the legal status of any organization which meets or may meet the legal prohibition.

"Any student or parent having doubts as to whether a particular organization comes within the statutory prohibitions should inquire either of the school principal or of the central office if the organization is approved," he said.

HE SAID the intent of the board of education to enforce this statute is not only on its statutory duty to do so, but also on its firm belief that the existence of prohibited membership in fraternities and sororities among its students "constitutes a serious threat to the maintenance of a decent respect for law among all of its students."

Board member Ross Hanson said "merely the clarification of an established policy."

Franklin Council Takes Action on Road Surfacing

FRANKLIN — The council held a special meeting Monday night to award its 1968-69 road contracts to George Stolaruk Company.

The \$29,359 contract will be used for a village-wide road project which just about completes the five-year reconstruction program. Five bids were submitted, the highest was \$30,395.

The council also approved street commissioner Richard Oberchulla's recommendation to have a 450 foot stretch of Senie Dr. from Franklin Road to Bradingham surfaced with soil cement. The place will be a test area for study and observation.

ROAD ADVISORY committee chairman Stan Kantor discussed the relative merits of surfacing materials and it was generally agreed that the test area would help determine the practical and practical benefits of soil cement.

It was the consensus of the council that the time had come to alter their neutral position regarding road surfacing.

A COMMITTEE headed by Oberchulla is considering the planning commission's recommendation that major roads in the village be hard-surfaced. Costs and types of materials are being studied; by July 8 the committee is to prepare a final report.
