The Birmingham Athletic Club, located on a six-acre site at W. Maple Road and Oakhills Drive, formally dedicated its summer facilities in July, 1959, at ceremonies conducted by Fred C. Matthei, Jr., BAC president. Diving and tennis exhibitions opened the swimming pool, locker room facilities and tennis courts, along with a wading pool for the youngsters. Excavation work on construction of the clubhouse began in October, 1959. The clubhouse was completed in April, 1960, at an approximate cost of \$140,000. Birmingham architects O'Dell, Hewlett and Luckenbach designed the BAC clubhouse to include two squash courts, locker facilities, dining room and cocktail lounge. The total club plant investment was estimated at \$360,000. Sid Coale, aerial photographer-pilot, snapped the BAC for The Eccentric's series.

It has now increased in value to just over \$22,500 because the stock market has been rising in this period (it also could fall, you know). AS THEY reduce their loan at the bank, or as the value of the stocks rises, they can pull back portions of their stock from the bank in case they need it. Meanwhile, it's just as safe in his vault as in theirs. Their one peril is that the stock market will go into a nosedive, in which case the banker will want more collateral. They don't have it. But their cottage is clear. They could always go out and get a mortgage on it to satisfy the banker, if they had to.
