

Torch Drive Announces Committee Cochairmen

R. Jamison Williams, 1923 Yarmouth, Birmingham, and W. D. MacDonnell, 1375 Glengarry, Bloomfield Township, have been named cochairmen of the 1962 Torch Drive Advance Gifts Committee, along with Mrs. W. Warren Shelden of Grosse Pointe.

The appointments were made by James H. Wiseman, Torch Drive cochairman for Advance Gifts.

Williams, president of American MacProducts Co., will again serve as chairman for men's teams, a post he held in the 1962 Torch Drive. MacDonnell, president of Kelsey-Hayes Corp., will head "Operation Thrust," through which a group of volunteers stage a model Torch Drive campaign among selected companies.

Williams, a native of Indianapolis and a graduate of the University of Michigan, joined American Metal Products in 1936 as a sales engineer. Successively, he held the posts of assistant plant manager, chief engineer of research and development, vice president, director and executive vice president before being named president in 1961.

Reports Made On Fairway Drive Opening

A request to open Fairway Drive from the Northlawn subdivision to Arden Lane was tabled for two weeks by Birmingham city commissioners Monday to allow time for the administration to prepare a report on the project.

Lee Showalter had talked to City Manager L. P. Gare about the possibility of opening the street for a distance of approximately 1,540 feet.

An informal hearing between commissioners and property owners did not want the street opened.

GARE SAID Showalter recently presented him with a list of owners of about 65 per cent of the frontage of the proposed opening who have now indicated that they are in favor of it.

The remaining 35 per cent of the owners, Gare said, have either indicated they are definitely opposed to the project or were undecided or could not be contacted.

Gare's report will include the cost of the right-of-way, sewers, water and the possible construction of a permanent pavement.

MacDONNELL was born in Boston and graduated from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He spent his entire career in the steel industry before joining Kelsey-Hayes as a vice president on Sept. 1, 1962, followed three months later by his election to the presidency.

He was president of Great Lakes Steel Co. from 1958 to 1962. Before joining Great Lakes, he worked for Bethlehem Steel Co. in Lackawanna, N. Y., and Johnstown, Pa.

The new "Operation Thrust" chairman has been closely identified with the Torch Drive in recent years and is a vice president of the United Foundation.

This year's "Give Once for All" drive will be held Oct. 15-Nov. 7. The goal will be announced in August.
