University of Detroit Seal Shows Wolves, Cooking Pot

Why are the dogs churning buter on the official seal of the University of Detroit?

Well, they're not dogs; it's not a butter churn they are pawing; and it's not just the seal of the university.

If you divorce the encircling text, "University of Detroit — 1877," from the seal you have the seal of the Society of Jesus, the Jesuit order.

The two animals are wolves, and the device between them is a cooking pot suspended over a fire on a chain.

THE WOLVES aren't cooking but warming their paws over the fire.

The seal is the coat of arms of the family of Loyola, of which St. Ignatius, the founder of the Society of Jesus in 1534, was a member.

This Spanish family goes back to at least the 10th Century. In 1261 the inheritance was held by a lady, Dona Ines de Loyola, who married Don Lope de Onaz.

The arms of both families were united into the Loyola seal which became the seal of the Society of Jesus and subsequently the seal of the University of Detroit.

WHY WOLVES? They represent the generosity of the House of Loyola; even wolves were welcome at the friendly hearth of Loyola.

There is also a play on Spanish words. "Lobo" (Spanish for wolf) which was the device for Spanish nobility joins with "olla" (Spanish for pot) as "lola y olla" (the wolf and the pot); all of which contracts into "Loyola."

Thus the left, or "sinister," half of the seal. The right, or, in the words of heraldry, "dexter," half of the seal is from the House of Onaz. (Remember? Inna Ines married Don Lope in 1261.)

IT CONSISTS of seven red bars on a field of gold. (The U. of D. school colors are red and white; gold presumably being too expensive.)

The seven red bars were worn on the shields of the House of Onaz by special grant of the King of Spain in recognition of the bravery of seven Onaz heroes who distinguished themselves in battle.

Only the Spanish King knows whether the U. of D. seal is correct; and he's dead.

Army Reservists Go On Two Weeks Duty

More than 2,500 Michigan and Indiana Army Reservists, members of the 70th Division (Training) at Fort Wayne, Ind., will be called to active duty Saturday for two weeks active duty training at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo.

Reservists from virtually every community in Metropolitan Detroit, including the Birmingham-Bloomfield area, will participate in the extensive training, designed to cover every phase of military life. The reservists will leave Metropolitan, Bishop (Print) and Pontiac City airports in 15 planes, starting at 8 a.m. Saturday.

THIS YEAR the division will be "satellited" to Fort Leonard Wood,

which means the reservists will be training and instructing recruits with their counterparts in the active army.

This is the second consecutive year the division has been satellited and allows the reservists to participate in the mission of the division. Brig. Gen. Hattel L. Harris, acting division commander, of Indiana, and Brig. Gen. Robert R. Owen, assistant division commander, of Fairfax, Birmingham, said in a joint statement: "The annual active duty training is the highlight of the year for the reserve program.

"THE ANNUAL encampment gives the officers and men of the division the opportunity to put into practice in the field what they have been studying and learning at Fort Wayne and other Reserve centers throughout the year.

"During these two weeks at Leonard Wood the officers and men will be living and working in the Army just as they would if they were called to active duty as a unit."

Boys' State Elects Mock Government

Two Birmingham-area boys were elected to top positions at the 26th annual Wolverine Boys' State on the Michigan State University campus in East Lansing June 18-20.

Chuck Bethel, Seaholm senior, was elected governor of the mock state government, while Larry Bell, also a senior at Seaholm, was elected state treasurer.

The American-sponsored Boys' State, attended by 1,500 teenagers from the state of Michigan, is planned as an exercise in all phases of city, county and state government.

THE BOYS live in mock cities and counties and belong to one of two mock political parties which nominate candidates for the various political offices.

Every office found in the real government is represented at Boys' State, with few exceptions.

Cities choose councilmen and justices of the peace; counties choose circuit judges, senators and representatives; and the state as a whole elects all the officials the real state of Michigan does.

OTHER Birmingham-area boys and the offices to which they were elected or appointed are Bob Swanson, board of trustees, Wayne State University; Art Heffelfinger, runner-up for the governorship and state police commissioner; Greg Akin, mayor of his city; Doug Parrish, Michigan State University board of trustees.

More include Roger Ulrich, state banking commissioner; Craig Johnson, executive secretary to the governor; Scott McNabb, state tax commissioner; Doug Manier, county treasurer; Allen Noftz, city councilman; Paul Newman, city councilman; John McGuckin, state party chairman; Doug Heiler, chaplain of house of representatives.

JAMES COOK, circuit judge and editor of Boys' State newspaper; Tom Dreschle, representative; Hugh McCoombe, county coroner; Gordy Willet, chief of police; and Serge Verloze, senator.

Russ Danielson of Birmingham, a member of "Taylor City" was fire chief and assistant to the city clerk.

Also attending from the Birmingham area were Jerome Betty, Dave Breedlove and Russel Donaldson.
