## Will-O-Way Initiates Run of Summer Plays

The curtain opens Friday on the first three-act play to be presented by the student repertory at Will-O-Way Apprentice Theatre, 775 W. Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills.

"Life with Father" will be performed by spring term students of the drama trade school, which has trained a number of rising young actors and actresses. Later public performances in the newly-launched repertory season will be presented by adult and university students in advanced summer classes now being enrolled.

**FOLLOWING LINDSAY** a and Crouse's "Life with Father" at 8:40 p.m. Friday, Saturday and Sunday, the Apprentice Theatre will present weekend performances of three tragedies, one Shakespearean play and a musical.

"Each of the productions was chosen to teach certain things," said Director Celia Merrill Turner in discussing the summer season which will begin a new chapter in Will-O-Way history.

Its purpose, Mrs. Turner said, is to give students semi-professional experience in performing before paid audiences. Previously, most of the Will-O-Way Apprentice Theatre productions were presented to invited audiences.

**LAUNCHED IN 1940**, the Apprentice Theatre offers a junior certificate to children, a senior certificate to teenage and university students, and a master certificate to professionals.

Thirty and 60-hour play production courses offered each term include full length Shakespearean plays, contemporary drama and experimental off-Broadway style plays.

Scene painting, mime, stagecraft and stage management are taught by Duane Peck, choreographer and

associate director of the Apprentice Theatre.

Both (Mrs. Suren) Pflaif of Wayne State University teaches costume design, scene design and painting.

**SPRING TERM** students performing in "Life with Father" range in age from a red-headed Harlan of seven to Father himself, aged 13.

"It's 'Life with Father' in miniature," says Director Turner. "The actors play roles seriously. But they understand the extra fun and satire in situations like a 13-year-old belittling but Father's roaring remarks."

Seats in the 125-capacity playhouse may be reserved by phoning Will-O-Way Apprentice Theatre. Friday night's sold out performance will be a benefit for the Pontiac Symphony.

**ALSO ON THE WILL-O-WAY** payroll this season are "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof," July 5 through 7; "The Crucible," July 12 through 14; "He Who Gets Slapped," July 19 through 21; "The Tempest," July 25 through 28, and "Finian's Rainbow," August 2 through 4 and 9 through 11.

Enrollments close July 1 for the summer classes which will present the three latter productions. Openings remain in several beginning and advanced classes, each limited to 12 students.

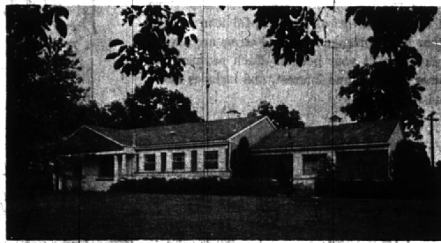

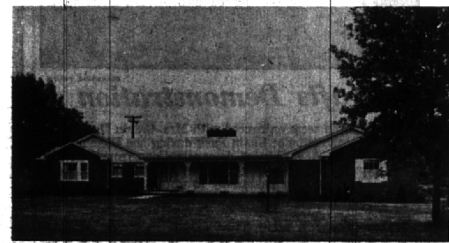

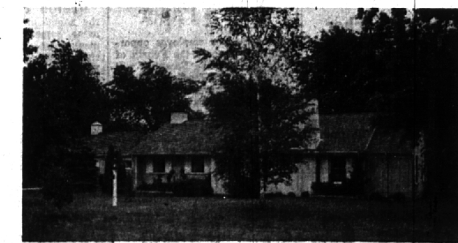
