### Resources Group Slates Open House At Pierce School

Business people, educators and interested adults are invited to attend an open house to be held by the Birmingham Area Community Resources Workshop at Pierce School cafeteria on Thursday, July 18, from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. This is the first such workshop to be held in Birmingham. It is given as a credit course by Michigan State University and is one of seventeen workshops being held this summer in Michigan. The workshop group of 49 teachers from the Birmingham schools and surrounding school districts has been making an intensive study of community resources available in the Birmingham Area for school use to enrich and stimulate the students' learning experiences.

WORKSHOP members have been making field trips to area industries, businesses and stores and interviewing people who might serve as resource persons to bring unique or special knowledge or experiences to the classroom. They have viewed films and inspected printed materials and charts which may aid them in their teaching. Under the guidance of Dr. Henry Corbacho, director of the instructional materials center for the Birmingham schools, the students are becoming proficient in the use of cameras, filmstrips, tape record-

ers and other modern classroom aids. Fritz Pihis, principal of Adams School, is workshop director, assisted by Dan Welch, principal of Pierce School. Some of the results of the four weeks work, which began on June 24, will be presented at the open house. Last week the workshop members toured the architects office of Smith Associates and the Meadowlake Elementary School. The trip, which was arranged through Richard Allyn AIA, was taken to illustrate one facet of community resources which can be used as a teaching aid in next semester's classroom program.

### Rezoned Lots Along Alley To Parking

Two small triangular lots along the alley that runs from Lincoln to Bird along Woodward were rezoned from single-family to parking by the Birmingham City Commission Monday night.

A request for the rezoning of a third lot in the area to be rezoned to parking was withdrawn after residents in the area protested. The property owners had felt the parking classification on the property would lower their property values and hinder their chances for an FHA loan.

### City Okays Land Buy For Alley

Birmingham City Manager L. R. Gare has been ordered to negotiate for property in the block bounded by Townsend, Pierce, Brown and Henrietta for the establishment of an alley. City commissioners authorized the move Monday night.

The alley, if constructed, will run in an east-west direction from Pierce to Henrietta. There will be 13 feet taken from the property on the north side of the alley and seven feet from the property on the south side for the right-of-way.

THE 13-SEVEN split will run to a point 100 feet from Pierce. A n eight-degree jog will be constructed and the split from abutting property owners on the other half of the alley will be an even 10-10 on both sides of the center line.

The property owners on the western half of the block, Frank Smith and the Chester Co., had been in disagreement over the amount of the land to be taken from their property for the right-of-way.

Smith had wanted a five-15 split and the Chester people the 13-seven.

CITY MANAGER L. R. Gare said the FHA would not guarantee a mortgage on residential property that abuts or fronts onto a commercial parking facility.

Several months ago the plan board had recommended that all of the triangular-shaped lots abutting the alley be rezoned to a parking classification.

The plan board had recommended, however, that the rezoning take place on an individual basis rather than as a blanket rezoning.

This is the second zoning change that the commission has approved since the planning board's recommendation.

south border and a similar 10-foot strip on the west.

RESIDENTS to the south of the commercial property want the decree altered to eliminate the greenbelt, to set the fence in 20 feet from the commercial property line—adding that amount of backyard to adjoining residences—and the fence to be a stockade-type eight feet high. They claim they will get better screening this way. Residents on the west want a similar six-foot setback and a stockade fence.

Owners of the commercial are agreeable to the changes. Township board members were divided over approval of a stockade-type fence, voting four to three against it as a straw-poll.

They asked residents to come back at the next board meeting with specific agreements concluded as to exactly what they propose in exchange for the court-decreed requirements.
