Approve Plan For Widening Of Telegraph

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie has approved a plan to build additional lanes to make Telegraph (US-24) a divided eight-lane highway between Grand River and I-696 in Detroit and Southfield.

Total cost of the four mile long project, scheduled to be put under contract in 1969, will be an estimated \$2.3 million.

Telegraph, one of the most heavily-traveled highways in Oakland and Wayne counties, is now a six-lane divided highway between Grand River and Eight Mile (M-102) and a four-lane divided highway between I-696 and North-western Highway.

The project will be done in two stages.

STAGE ONE calls for construction of four new lanes to carry southbound traffic between Eight Mile and I-696, a distance of 2.8 miles. The existing southbound lanes, built in 1930, would then be removed.

Two lanes would be added to the existing northbound pavement, built in 1956. The median, which is now 20 feet wide, would be expanded to a width of 60 feet.

The project includes some revisions to a 32-year-old interchange at Telegraph and Eight Mile—one of the first cloverleafs built in the nation.

The expansion of Telegraph will be done within the existing 204-foot right-of-way and will not require purchase of additional land, Mackie said.

Stage two calls for adding one lane to both the north and southbound roadways from Eight Mile south to the vicinity of Grand River and Seven Mile Rd. This phase will be built at a later date when funds are available.

TELEGRAPH IS A divided eight-lane highway from Grand River south to I-94 and will be modernized later this year south of I-94 to a connection with I-75.

Mackie said Telegraph, which now carries an average of 35,000 vehicles per day on some sections, and is expected to double during the next 20 years.

Mackie said the expansion of Telegraph Rd. will play a major role in the future growth of Southfield, already one of the Motor City's fastest-growing suburbs.

Southfield, which had a population of 31,501 in 1960, is expected to have a population of nearly 90,000 by 1980. Southfield has neither rail or water transportation facilities and all industry is serviced by trucks which use either Telegraph or Eight Mile.

'Healer' Robs Elderly Man

Nicholas Diakos, 84, of 1829 S. Boulevard, Troy, was robbed at his home Friday by an assailant who described himself as an "Indian healer."

Diakos told Troy police the man came to his back door and said, "I am an Indian healer, and I want to help you."

WHEN DIAKOS replied, "I don't want any help," the man pulled him off the porch and grabbed his wallet containing \$32.

Diakos said the "Indian healer" was dark-complected, wore small mustache and stood about 5 feet 8 inches tall.

New Law Aids Mentally Ill

Shift of emphasis in the care of the mentally ill is foreseen under a law enacted by the legislature this year.

The so-called community mental health services bill was sponsored by Sen. F. A. Roberts, R-Pontiac, and seven of his colleagues.

In signing the measure into law, Gov. George Romney lauded the intent of the bill, saying it will "give local citizens more power to establish the kind of mental health programs their communities need."

Similar measures were proposed in previous sessions during the administration of Democratic Gov. John B. Swainson on recommendation of State Mental Health Director Charles Wagg. Each failed to gain the needed Republican support in the legislature.

ROBERTS' BILL would allow boards of supervisors to establish a 12-man community mental health board.

Creation of the board would be contingent on majority approval of the county board of supervisors. Any program devised by the community board would be submitted to the State Mental Health Department for approval.

If approved, the state would match local funds, up to 60 percent of the cost of the program.

Romney agreed with the sponsors of the bill, who contended the community program would "stretch dollars a remarkable way for mental health by permitting local units to channel the funds into the services which are most essential."
