B of E Studies School 'Drop Out' Statistics

Statistics on the number of seniors in the Birmingham School System who graduated and failed to graduate (either "dropping out" or receiving certificates of attendance) and figures on the summer school enrollment were presented to the board of education at its meeting last week.

The figures showed that 92.25 per cent of the seniors completing their senior year qualified for graduation; 2.75 per cent qualified for certificates of attendance; 4.98 per cent failed to qualify for either.

IN ORDER TO graduate, seniors—among other requirements must have maintained an honor point average of at least 1.5 on a 4.0 system.

Those who receive certificates of attendance have failed to qualify on the honor point average but have met all other requirements. Those who fail to qualify for either have not met the additional requirements.

MSU Studies Change In State Wage Picture

Firms planning to locate in Michigan or to leave Michigan are advised to look at some new figures on average wages.

Two members of Michigan State University's bureau of business and economic research have found that Michigan's much publicized high wages may be a statistical illusion.

Writing in the current issue of "Michigan Economic Record," Dr. Roger L. Bowley and David I. Verway conclude that "the industrial structure of Michigan explains 80 per cent of the apparent difference between Michigan and U.S. factory wages."

THE 1958 CENSUS shows Michigan's average hourly wage for that year as \$2.65 and the national average as \$2.19. The true difference, the MSU researchers said, was only 9 cents, up 40¢, not 46 cents.

Michigan workers, said the authors, get about the same pay as workers doing the same job in other states.
