During his career, Ambrosiano has learned the food secrets of 32 countries and enough languages to make him feel at home anywhere, with any nationality.



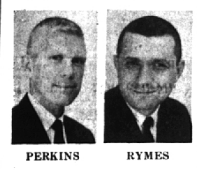

The two men will be headquartered in the Guerdon Bldg., Southfield.

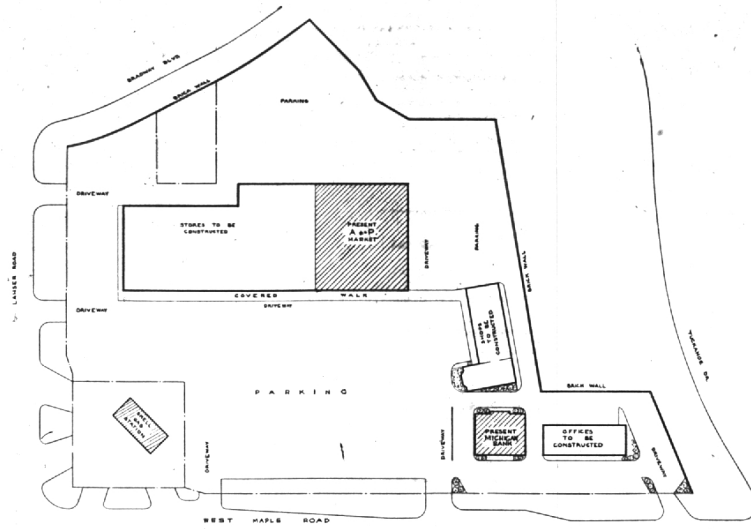
### Insurance Men, Families Attend Mackinac Confab
