## Announce Construction Of Executive Building

Construction of a contemporary office building, The Executive Building, at 600 E. Maple Ave., Birmingham, has been announced by Carl Larson, 4880 Ardmore Drive, Bloomfield Hills. Located next to the Birmingham Motel in the E. Maple office center, it will be a two-story structure with a floor area of approximately 6,000 square feet. The first floor will be of white brick veneer construction with wide-open view windows. The second floor will be of brick to lend a casual, outdoor-indoor atmosphere.

The second floor will be curtain wall and window construction, affording an open-air view.

WINDOWS ARE equipped with neutral color glass designed to absorb glaring and fading solar rays. All offices will have individually zoned air conditioning and temperature control.

Offices as well as corridors will be enclosed with natural grained wood paneling and sound deadener insulation.

An open-view entry with all glass and aluminum on two sides will open up to a stairway leading to the second floor. The other two entry walls will be of brick to lend a casual, outdoor-indoor atmosphere.

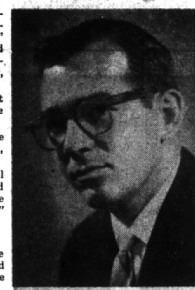
Continuing Education, Michigan State University, and director of the Michigan workshops, will also be present at the open house.
