Realty Company Hits at Beverly Planning Board

BEVERLY HILLS—A charge by Donald Armstrong of the Alger F. Quast Co. that the planning board did not give his request to have the convalescent home use included under Business I zoning in the village ordinance a good hearing was made at the council meeting Monday.

The company wants to build a convalescent home on 18 Mile Road west of Southfield. The property is zoned Business I, but the convalescent home usage does not appear in any part of the village zoning ordinances.

"In denying our request," Armstrong said, "the planning board acted on their own personal likes and dislikes with regard to the building and did not discuss the petition, which was to include the usage under the present Business I zoning."

THE COUNCIL requested that the planning board be contacted and in some further elaboration give their denial. They also requested that Village Clerk Betty J. Chinn get a report on the condition of Field Financial Corp. of Minneapolis, Minn., who will finance the building.

The inclusion of the usage in any part of the ordinance could be made only after public hearings. When contacted later, Herman Draxick, chairman of the planning board, said: "A convalescent home certainly does not come under Business I usage. What more can the board say?"

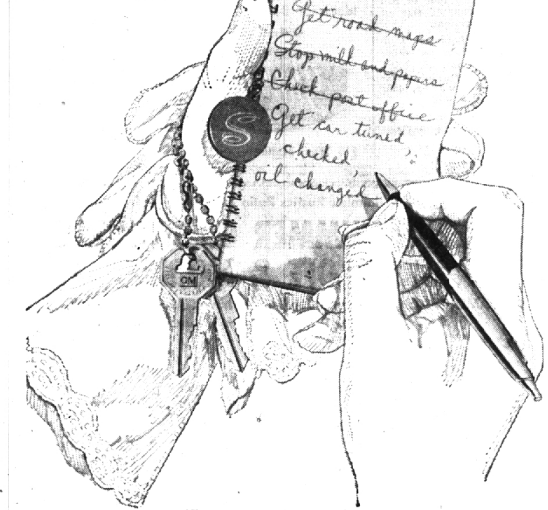
