2 Contracts Approved for Stony Creek

The Board of Commissioners of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, a five-county regional park agency, serving Livingston, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw and Wayne Counties, approved two contracts at its monthly meeting held July 11.

Kenneth L. Hallenbeck, director of the authority, said that both contracts concerned Stony Creek Metropolitan Park, a 3,500-acre recreational site under development between Rochester and Romeo and expected to open for limited public use some time in 1984.

The Schurzer Construction Co., Pontiac, was awarded a contract in the amount of \$236,400 for the construction of a steel and brick bathroom building at the Baypoint Beach site at Stony Creek Metropolitan Park.

DESIGNED to accommodate the swimmers coming to the park, the bathroom includes space for dressing rooms, showers, basket clothes-checking, restrooms, first-aid station, storage areas and a sheltered plaza.

A contract in the amount of \$6,595 was awarded to Folgmann Electric Co., Detroit, for electrical underground service to the beach-house and pumping station.

Among members of the Authority's Board of Commissioners is R. Clare Cummings of Pontiac, serving Oakland County.
