Mission Nurse Talks On Indians in Alaska

The regular board meeting of the McCosky Convocation of the Episcopal Church will feature Jean Dementi, mission nurse from Shageluk, an Indian village in the Missionary District of Alaska.

Mrs. Dementi will speak at St. David's Episcopal Church, W. 12 Mile Road, Southfield, Monday at 12:30 p.m. Members of the convocation will meet for lunch at 11:30 a.m. The board will meet at 10 a.m.

Mrs. Dementi, as a missionary nurse delivers babies, cares for the sick, gives immunization shots, runs a small bakery and has taken part in starting an annual summer camp for the children of the village of Shageluk, Anvik and Holikachuk.

The Rev. Dr. Ernest Gordon, dean, Princeton University Chapel, will be guest preacher at Kirk in the Hills, Bloomfield Hills, at 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. services Sunday.

A native of Scotland, Dr. Gordon completed his theological studies in Edinburgh and Glasgow and also at the Hartford Seminary Foundation Hartford, Conn.

During World War II he served with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders and for three and a half years was a prisoner of war of the Japanese.

DR. GORDON is the author of several books, the latest of which are "Through the Valley of the River Kwai" (1953).
