It has been reported that more than 25,000 people attended the recent Southfield Fair sponsored by local groups. The proceeds reached approximately \$15,500.

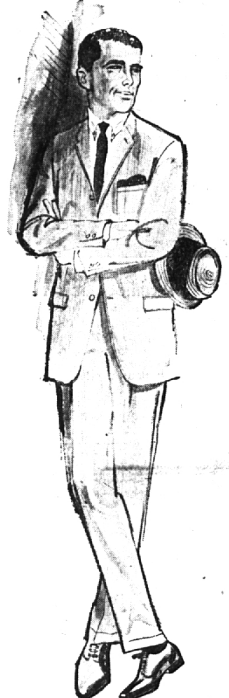


Bride-Elect

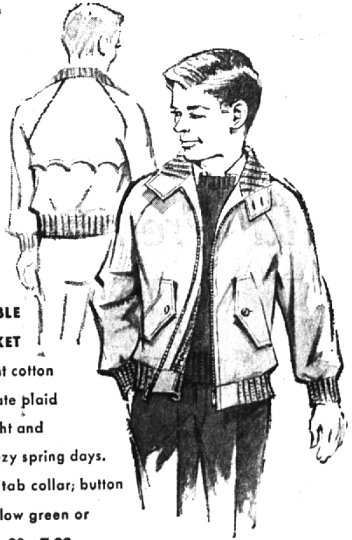
