## Miss Hodnick Becomes Bride Of Dr. Knoll

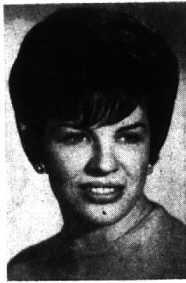

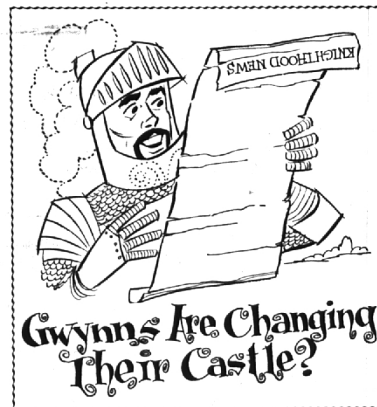
