IN WEST BLOOMFIELD Centaur Stables Unveils New Riding Facilities

Centaur Farm Stables, reputed to be one of the most modern public indoor and outdoor riding facilities and recreation areas in the nation, was unveiled to the press Wednesday.

Complete with a huge, Olympiad indoor riding ring and stable for 64 horses, Centaur Stables is located on 100 wooded acres at Walnut Lake and Drake roads, two miles west of Orchard Lake Road in West Bloomfield Township.

ANTHONY B. PRATT, general manager, described the stables as "a complete public facility for boarding of horses and individual or group riding instruction from beginners to advanced levels in riding, jumping, hunting and show-ing."

Classes have already begun for private and group lessons and 30 horses will be accepted for boarding on a monthly basis. Professionally trained instructors are Danny Sullivan and Joe Beemer (Justice Colt).

Centaur, which features 50,000 square feet of space under roof, also boasts a 125,000 square foot jump field, exercise paddocks and a training ring and between 70

and 80 acres of wooded rolling hills are being prepared for trail riding and jump courses.

"IN ADDITION to being the first of its kind in Michigan, Centaur Stables is unique in the nation," said Pratt. "Ours is the newest and certainly one of the very largest including the outstanding features of most of the others."

Covering the lower six feet of the walls is a slanted wooden "knee wall" to provide extra protection to the horse and rider.

All building units are equipped with electronic fire detection and alarm systems, special fire-fighting equipment and trained personnel.

PRATT SAID that in addition to the riding instruction and boarding, Centaur Stables will make its facilities available for rental fee group affairs and service clubs. These include an air-conditioned observation lounge and a large restaurant that overlooks the riding ring.

Centaur, McMahon Associates of Birmingham were the architects for the observation lounge and restaurant and living quarters building.

VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 72

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 29 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORIES AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS; THE SIZE OF OPEN SPACES; THE DENSITY OF POPULATION; THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS AND LAND FOR TRADE, RESIDENCE AND OTHER PURPOSES; CREATING DISTRICTS FOR SAID PURPOSES AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS AND BOUNDARIES OF SUCH DISTRICTS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; ESTABLISHMENT OF A ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE."

The Village of Beverly Hills Ordains:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 29, being the Zoning Ordinance, be and the same hereby is amended by amending the Zoning Map attached thereto and made a part thereof as follows:

That the following described property is changed from a single family residential 2 zone use to Parking (P) zone use, to wit:

Lots 56 to 60, both inclusive, of D. J. Healy's Golfhurst Subdivision, Village of Beverly Hills, Oakland County, Michigan.

Section 2.01. Public hearing having been held hereon on July 15, 1963, and the statutory notices having been published and mailed, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety and are hereby ordered to take effect immediately upon publication.

Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, Michigan, on the 15th day of July, 1963.
