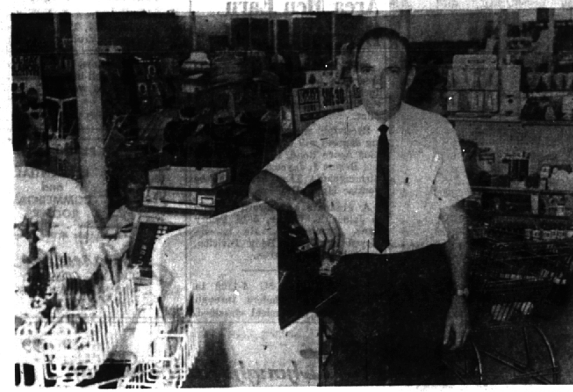

Sealed bids for the purchase of tax anticipation notes of School District of the City of Birmingham, Michigan, of the par value of \$1,500,000.00 will be received by the undersigned at Room 101 of Education Office, Chester and Martin Streets, Birmingham, Michigan, until 8:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on the 7th day of August, 1963, at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

The notes will be dated July 15, 1963, will mature March 1, 1964 and will bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 4% per annum. Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company to be designated by the original purchaser of the notes, which paying agent qualifies as such under the statutes of the State of Michigan or of the Federal Government. Denominations and form of notes to be at the option of the purchaser. Accrued interest to date of delivery of such notes must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

For the purpose of awarding the notes the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the notes from Sept. 1, 1963, to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. The notes will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the municipality. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the notes or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

The loan is in anticipation of the operating tax due and payable December 1, 1963.

Envelopes containing the bids should be plainly marked "Proposal for Notes".

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of 2% of the par value of the notes, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer or trust company each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid be accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the notes. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of the purchaser's attorney approving the legality of the notes, to be secured at the purchaser's expense. The purchaser shall furnish notes ready for execution of his expense. Notes will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan.

Elect Accountant To CPA Institute

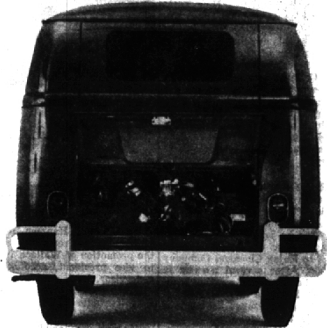
Daniel William Brodbeck, CPA, of 887 Lakeview, Birmingham, has been elected a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.
