Member Elected To Republican State Committee

The election of Alice Schoenholtz, 1121 W. Twelve Mile Road, Royal Oak, as a member of the Republican State Central Committee was announced recently by Charles L. Lyle, Republican county chairman.

The vacancy on the committee was created by the resignation of Mrs. Robert Lowry, 1420 Ashover Drive, Birmingham, who is moving to Rochester, N. Y.

According to Michigan election laws, the State Central members have the power to fill a vacancy. The three remaining State Central members from Oakland County, Palmer Bunday of Davisburg, James Dickerson, 720 Westwood, Birmingham, and Mrs. Charles Campbell of Pontiac, met Saturday to elect the new member.

Small Game Hunters Have Good Year

Hunters of small game in Michigan in 1962 had a good year, according to final estimates of the Department of Conservation.

The ruffed grouse kill of 548,170 was highest since 1953, and the woodcock total of 118,580 was the highest ever.

Total pheasant take last year was 655,660, an increase of 100,000 over 1961, but short of the million-plus totals of the early fifties.

COTTONTAILS again led all small game hunters' game bags. The 1962 total was 1,277,260, one of the highest figures for cottontails in several years.

The duck kill dropped about 100,000 from the year-ago figure, to 158,450. This was no surprise to Department biologists, who mention such contributing factors as reduced bag limits, length of season, and the habitat conditions, species limitations and other restricting circumstances.

THE GOOSE kill for 1962 was estimated at 11,800, down from the year earlier total of 21,240.

Other kill figures included coots, 10,500; snowshoe hares, 285,800; squirrels, 698,580; and raccoons, 181,450.

Hunter numbers for all species last year included ruffed grouse, 180,690; pheasant, 456,810; woodcock, 690,900; squirrel, 224,610; ducks, 52,150; goose, 25,540; coot, 6,300; cottontail, 353,050; snowshoe hare, 69,610; and raccoon, 37,230.

State Police Issues Call For Trainees

Sgt. John Amthor commanding officer of the Pontiac post of the State Police, has issued a "last call" for young men who desire to enroll in the training school for State Police officers scheduled this fall.

The application deadline is mid-night Sunday.

Young men 21 to 29 years of age, married or single, not less than five feet 10 inches in height and with a high school education or its equivalent are eligible to apply, he said.

FOR FULL information and application forms they may get to any State Police post or write to the State Civil Service Commission in Lansing.

"This is an excellent opportunity to join this fine career service," Sgt. Amthor said.

And among many benefits are a new five-day week, new high pay scale, paid vacations and paid sick leave, a daily subsistence allowance, free uniforms and a pension plan that permits the officer to retire at the end of 25 years of service at half pay, with the same pension going to his wife if she survives him.

"But they must act now if they wish to enter this school."

College Expenses Rise Faster than Enrollment

Operating expenses of universities and colleges rise faster than the numbers of students enrolled.

Merritt M. Chambers, University of Michigan professor of higher education gives six reasons for this:

"Step-ups in salaries, wages, fringe benefits, and prices of essential supplies occur each year.

"Constant rise in the level of instruction and the level of educational maturity of students in universities and four-year colleges makes the instruction necessarily more expensive.

"New programs of instruction and research, creating temporary 'islands of high cost,' must be added with growing frequency to keep ahead of economic and technological changes.

"LARGE LECTURE classes in combination with small group-sections, use of closed-circuit television, automated teaching machines and tape recorders are all ways of supplementing and enriching instruction, but cannot be depended upon to reduce costs, the equipment is costly, requires space and main-

Water Accidents Show Slight Drop Over '62 Totals

More detailed figures are available in only 116 of the accidents, the full reports on the others having not yet been received.

These show that 69 were fatal, 36 personal injury and 21 property damage only. There were 60 persons injured and the breakdown on types of accidents in which 69 drowned follows:

Ten boat operators, 15 boat passengers, 25 aviators or waders, three fell through the ice and 16 fell from a bridge, bank, dock, pier or similarly. Of those in the latter classification or who fell through the ice seven were children under 10 years of age.

There have been 103 drownings and 148 water accidents in Michigan this year up through July 15, according to a provisional report by the State Police.

This compares with 106 drownings and 170 accidents up through July 9, 1962.

Of the accidents this year 91 were fatal.
