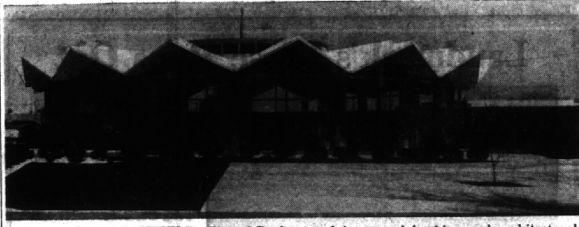

**THE NEW BLOOMFIELD** office of Bank of the Commonwealth will closely follow this design, of the Bank's existing Garden City office. A bank in the round, it has been featured in several banking and architectural publications. The interior of the Bloomfield office will be modified slightly for rearrangement of space.

## Bank of the Commonwealth Opens Bloomfield Branch

Bank of the Commonwealth, second oldest bank in the Detroit metropolitan area, has opened its 28th branch banking office at Woodward Ave. and Square Lake Road, Bloomfield Township.  
Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Frederick C. Ziem dismissed a suit Friday in which the Pontiac State Bank and the Community National Bank of Pontiac sought to prevent opening of the Commonwealth bank branch. (The bank's temporary trailer had opened briefly May 1.)  
The Bloomfield office is designed to furnish all banking services. It will provide parking, drive-in windows and safe deposit boxes. Complete trust facilities are being contemplated.  
The PERMANENT new office should be completed in Feb. 1964. In the meantime, banking service is being furnished from the auto trailer bank.  
Longer banking hours are offered, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday.  
The Bloomfield office operates under the direction of Vice President E. W. Parrish and Manager William H. Knapp.  
Bank of the Commonwealth was organized in 1916 and is one of two remaining banks in Detroit known and organized at the time of the bank holiday in 1933.  
IN THE RECENT suit, the Pontiac banks charged that approval by State Banking Commissioner Charles D. Slay for the Bloomfield branch was "unlawful and unreasonable."  
Judge Ziem said his ruling only could be based upon whether Slay acted unlawfully or unreasonably. He said he was not empowered to substitute his judgment for that of the commissioner, although he agreed there was no substantial or obvious need for the branch bank.  
According to Commissioner Slay and the Bank of the Commonwealth, population figures and reports indicated more banking facilities were needed in the township area.  
THE PONTIAC banks said Pontiac State Bank's branch at Miracle Mile Shopping Center and the Community National Bank's Woodward office were adequate to meet area needs.  
In his 21-page opinion, Judge Ziem also ruled for Commissioner Slay's designation of the Miracle Mile as a village. Only cities incorporated a and unincorporated villages may have bank branches under state banking law.

**Husband Given 12 to 40 Years In Wife's Death**  
The husband of a Southfield woman who admitted he clubbed her to death April 20 was sentenced Monday to 12 to 40 years in Jackson Prison by Oakland County Circuit Judge William J. Beer.  
James H. Butler, 31, pleaded guilty July 12 to the charge of second-degree murder. Estranged from his wife for several weeks, he had been living in Taylor Township.  
MRS. BUTLER, 23, was fatally beaten with a rifle butt at her home, 28493 Brentwood.  
Butler had planned to shoot himself but became frightened when she began to scream and instead murdered her. Their 22-month-old daughter, Debra, was asleep at the time.

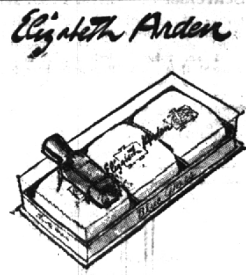
