Landmark's Lease Runs Out



The Bloomfield Hills Barbecue, a landmark at 1620 N. Woodward and Long Lake Road closed its doors Sunday. Owners Mr. and Mrs. Joseph H. Kreilach had been there 18 years, but their lease ran out, and Secony-Vacuum has leased the corner for 30 years. The barbecue is being torn down.

According to Kreilach, the grocery part of the combined store-restaurant was 125 years old. The building had been added onto three times.



THE KREILACHS lived upstairs over Bloomfield Hills Barbecue during their years of ownership. Their whole family worked there at different times, said Kreilach. The barbecue had been serving 19 hours a day for the last 18 years. Mr. Kreilach worked at night, and Mrs. Kreilach worked during the day. Bloomfield Hills Barbecue was open seven days a week and closed only five days a year.

On approximately Aug. 15, the Kreilachs will open their food operation in Bloomfield Lanes, 1520 N. Woodward, Bloomfield Hills. This will be a temporary move until they open another food and refreshment business next year.

The gas station that is going up, while their Bloomfield Hills Barbecue is being torn down, backdrops Mr. and Mrs. Joseph H. Kreilach, who have owned and operated the barbecue for 18 years.

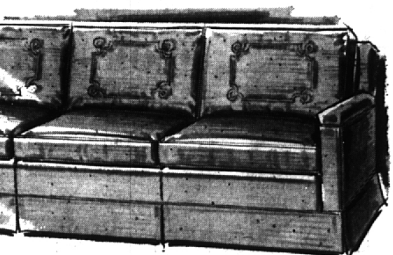
