

Moving to Country? Check Water Supply

If you're moving beyond the city water mains, you'd better be sure that you have a water system installed capable of delivering an adequate supply of pure water. Fifty gallons per person per day used to be recommended, but with an increasing number of water-using appliances, and two or more bathrooms in most quality homes, 100 gallons per person per day is the suggested minimum, says the Water Systems Council.

Demands of the modern appliances are in addition for example to the 30 gallons required for each bath and the four to six gallons that flow each minute from a shower head or faucet.

FOR FIRE protection beyond city mains, FHA minimum property standards call for 300 gallons per hour delivery.

The council points out that a competent water systems dealer can provide the proper pump for a well so that it can meet the particular demands of your family, and can size other components of the system.

The water systems dealer will also know what equipment to utilize if your water system depends on a low-yield well. He might suggest a pump that works at a lower rate for a longer time with a pressure tank that compensates for slower pumping.

James Schooly Named to Faculty Of Wittenberg

Appointment of Dr. James B. Schooly to Highland Park to the Wittenberg University faculty has been announced by Wittenberg President John N. Stauffer.

Dr. Schooly, a member of the faculty at Highland College since 1948, will come to Wittenberg in September as assistant professor of biology. He replaces Dr. Knut J. Norstog who is joining the faculty of the University of South Florida. The new Wittenberg faculty member earned his bachelor of arts degree at the University of Michigan in 1939. He served during World War II with the U.S. Army in the Pacific, then returned to Wayne State University, where he earned a master of education degree in 1948. His master of science degree was earned at the University of Michigan in 1952 and his doctor of philosophy degree was earned at Michigan in January, 1963.

State Police Give Total Of Arrests

State Police officers made 18,298 arrests in June, 16,709 for traffic offenses and 1,589 on criminal complaints, according to the department's monthly activity report.

In addition, 476 juvenile traffic offenders were arrested and 505 delinquent and three wayward minors apprehended.

Troopers assisted 7,811 motorists, gave 28,559 oral warnings, investigated 10,596 cars and made 11,651 property and 2,845 liquor inspections.

Department vehicles traveled 1,897,761 miles, of which 1,142,898 were on traffic patrol and 754,863 for investigating criminal and other complaints.

THE IDENTIFICATION bureau received 11,338 sets of fingerprints, of which 5,509 were criminal and 5,829 noncriminal. Forty-three wanted persons were identified.

Of 1,588 applicants for permits to carry concealed weapons, 169 were identified with criminal records through their fingerprints.

Scientific crime laboratory personnel conducted 399 examinations, of which 247 were on questioned documents, 57 on firearms, 33 on tool markings, 22 on botanical specimens, 14 microscopic, 11 in shoe impressions and 15 miscellaneous.

Laboratory assistances numbered 47 for State Police units, 34 for other police departments, 10 for sheriffs and nine miscellaneous.

Birds Sing First Song With Warble

Ever wonder how birds "learn to sing?" The first song is generally an indefinite warble and it may be given by nestlings, according to Andrew J. Berger, University of Michigan associate professor of anatomy and noted field ornithologist.

"I first heard one of my hand-raised male Kingbirds warbling, sing when it was about 38 days old," says Berger, who has his own private aviary adjoining his home. "It gave a very low, hoarse warble resembling somewhat the song of the purple Finch."

Actually, little is known about the songs of others are almost wholly learned from older birds (as skylark and linnet).

"Among still other species the young birds' song apparently is 'innate' but the adult song is learned (as seems to be case with the European robin, blackbird and chaffinch)."

Berger notes that adult birds may also imitate the songs or calls of other birds. "These birds could, of course, make just as much noise by singing their own songs, so we really have no explanation for this kind of birds songs," he admits.

One smart way to thread a needle quickly and easily is to push the needle through a small sheet of white paper until just the eye of the needle is visible. It will show up clearly against its white background.

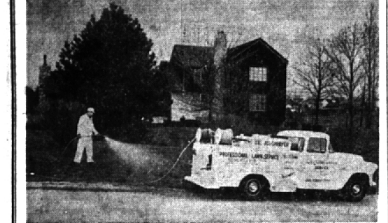
