

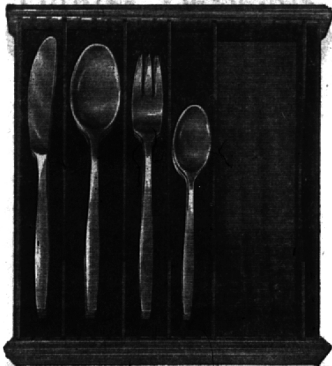

The 15-year-old veteran of Girl Scout, "YW" Cavell and church camping is still not quite used to her new title of "Miss Marilyn" to the 100 morning Kiddie Kampers, all-day Girl Campers and the afternoon Drop-In boys and girls, who swarm into the building daily.

"As a camper," recalls Marilyn, "I used to be critical of leaders during dull stretches and wonder why they didn't make our programs more interesting. Now, I'm seeing it from the other side of the fence."

NO STRANGER to the restive ways of the young, the Seaholm High School junior, has done tons of babysitting, and is the oldest in the family of three at the Jack D. McCullough home.

"A babysitter adjusts to the child's pattern at home, which is quite different from the group patterns of kids whose ages range from four to 12 years," said Marilyn.

Along with five other girls enrolled in the first recreation leadership training class at the branch, Marilyn is learning to soothe a tearful four-year-old, how to persuade a shy Day Campers to join in an activity or disengage an angry 10-year-old.
