

Former Ford Executive To Be Litton Consultant

James O. Wright, former group vice president and member of the board of the Ford Motor Co., has been named a consultant to Litton Industries, Charles E. Thornton, chairman of the board of Litton, announced last week.

Thornton said Wright will counsel with Litton's corporate officers on forward planning in selected fields of interest to Litton of Beverly Hills, Calif.

Included in Litton's product lines are electronic systems for defense, business machines and associated equipment and products, as well as commercial electronic equipment and services and nuclear-powered submarines.

With 43,000 employees, Litton has 82 plants and laboratories in the United States and abroad.

WRIGHT JOINED Ford at the end of World War II in the new planning organization established at that time by Henry Ford II.

He later held top executive posts in Ford's finance, manufacturing and purchasing departments, being named director of purchasing in 1955 and assistant general manager of the Ford Division in 1960.

A year after he became general manager of the Ford Division and a vice president of the company.

When Robert S. McNamara, now secretary of defense, was named president of Ford in 1960, Wright succeeded him as group vice president in charge of all of Ford's car and truck divisions.

Wright resigned from Ford on May 1 of this year.

A NATIVE of Norfolk, Va., Wright received a BS degree from North Carolina State College and a law degree from George Washington University. He served as a lieutenant colonel in the Air Force during World War II and received the Legion of Merit award.

Wright is active in community and civic affairs in the Birmingham area and is a member of the American Management Association; District of Columbia and Virginia Bars; Greater Detroit Board of Commerce; Air Force Association; Board of Trustees of George Washington University; Board of Trustees of Grace Hospital, Detroit; and the Board of Directors of the United Foundation of Detroit.
