

# 'The Cape' Is Theme Of Teen-agers' Dance

Birmingham high school and college students will finally have their chance to get together at a dance — "The Cape!" — tomorrow night at Eton Park. Featuring two bands, "The Tremelos" and "The Downbeats," The Cape will be informal and last from 8 p.m. to midnight.

Down will come the tennis nets, and the winter time skating rink will be filled with the sound of rock 'n' roll and the beat of hundreds of feet doing the new summertime dances. An outgrowth of the desire of Birmingham teenagers to have something to do on a summer night, The Cape is not an activity planned by adults for children — it is the brain child of a 75 member teenage committee.

(Continued from 1-A) change was under consideration by the council, he said. During the discussion Councilman Vincent Zetell said: "There were some comment made to me last week that we've been trying to push this thing through. The council has been working on this ordinance for almost nine months and it has been well-advertised."

ZATELL SAID he had been inclined to vote for the ordinance because the \$450 per apartment unit would be added to the city tax revenue and would help pay for much-needed improvements in the city. Later, Zetell explained that the zoning had twice before been rejected.

"It is evident that multiple dwelling goes against the general feeling of the people of Lathrup," he said. "They want to be a single dwelling city."

Thomas N. Reed, 28684 Blackstone, said the need for more money is not new but has just become more aggravated. He suggested that the valuation of all property in Lathrup be increased 10 per cent. "The city would derive the benefit," he said. "But, to raise our millage I'm dead against."

CITY ATTORNEY Everett Hayes warned residents to "be on the lookout" for further attempt to bring apartments to the city. The rezoning was proposed for an area west of Evans Drain in the northwest area of the city, south of 12 Mile Road. A portion of the defeated ordinance — proposed rezoning of 12 Mile from Guy Place to Santa Barbara from residential to limited office use (R-2) — will go before a public hearing Aug. 26.

(Continued from 1-A) Smith said his group felt the R-7 classification would permit a more dense development and also would permit more intensive use of the land. The plan board felt the property could adequately be developed in its existing R-6 classification and it would be in character with the present conditions in the area.

THE PHASE of the petition requesting the rezoning of the 13 lots along the south side of Villa between Columbia and Eton from two-family R-4 to the R-7 would not promote the health, safety and welfare of the community, according to the plan board report.

The tier of lots, Smith said, presently offers what would be considered a buffer zone district between the multiple-family property to the north and the single-family to the south. (In another report to the commission the plan board recommended that the City look into the possibility of purchasing the land for recreational facilities to serve the area.)

The plan board said the rezoning would be eliminating a very valuable buffer from single-family property.

FOLLOWING THE "Combo Clash" at the beginning of the summer, interest was aroused for a more permanent summertime activity. The Cape is the product of such an interest.

This is just a beginning. The success of the Cape will lead to further dances every week until the start of school and perhaps a teenage night club during the school year.

The cost of the dance, 50 cents per person, will be used to pay the bands and provide an operating revenue for future ventures.

The Cape is of the teenagers, by the teenagers and for the teenagers, so come on out tomorrow and let's dance.

Insofar as world problems are concerned, certainly the decade of the Sixties will record that Soviet Russia's invasion of Cuba be at the top of history's list. The second part of this tragedy is the fact that, to date, the great United States has done nothing to eliminate the menace of Russia's threat, both to North and South America. Speeches are poor substitutes for right action, when the need for action is paramount to mere words.

"The real problem of education in the United States is not that the nation needs more schools and more teachers — indeed, the problem is a need for a more practical educational pattern," soliloquized the Sage of Big Beaver, as he sat on his back porch, watching the birds and the flowers. "Education needs to lose some of its frills and then gain some of the character — building fundamentals that have made previous generations capable of developing and supporting the greatest self-governing Republic on earth."

Experts on the subject are broadcasting facts about the future problems the nation will encounter in seeking fresh water.
