

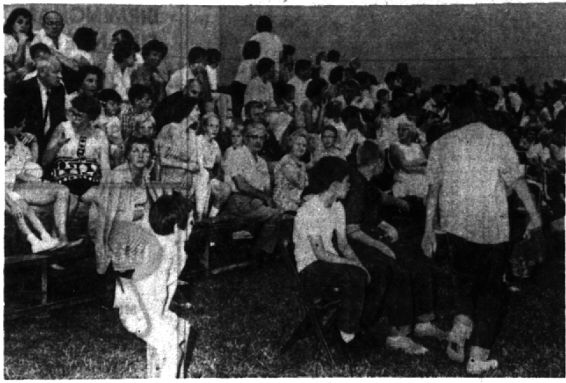

Link Diploma in High School To Getting Job

People without high school diplomas are in rough shape in the labor market, Seymour L. Wolfbein, director of the office of manpower, automation and training at the U.S. Department of Labor, said at the University of Michigan.

"Two out of every three people unemployed don't have a high school diploma," he said at a guidance workshop session sponsored by the school of education.

"A HIGH SCHOOL diploma is becoming a requirement for an increasing number of occupations," Wolfbein noted. "In spite of the growing need for this level of education, the U.S. Department of Labor has estimated that about 7.5 million young persons will be entering the labor market during the 1960's without completing high school.

"About 1.5 million young men and women without a high school education, who may be entering the labor market in 1964 and 1965, will be competing for jobs. Many of these young persons will not even have completed grade school."

"One out of four dropouts was unemployed in 1962," Wolfbein said. "This is one of the highest unemployment rates for any group in the labor force. Unless these young persons are able to secure additional training, they will probably become the nucleus of the future hard core of unemployed workers."

Free Course Shows Blind Use of Cane

The Blind Service Center of Metropolitan Detroit announces that it offers as a free service a scientific course of instruction in the use of the cane.

The agency, metropolitan Detroit's pioneering organization for the blind, is making this service available to any blind person in the tri-county area.

The method used was developed in World War II for blinded veterans. It affords the blind person the greatest possible freedom of movement and safety.

In addition, the remaining senses of the individual—hearing, touch and smell—are developed to the point of maximum efficiency.

THE NEW PROGRAM is designed to overcome one of the greatest problems caused by blindness: an extreme restriction in a person's ability to travel independently.

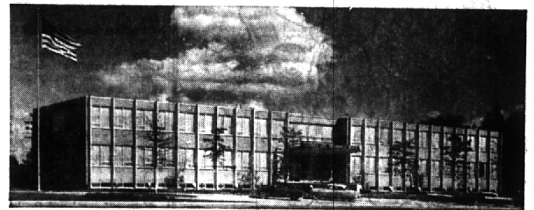

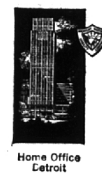
