

Records Shattered in Area Swim Competition

Forest Hills Edges Closest Rival, 194-185

In an aura of excitement and with a photo finish, Forest Hills Swim Club of Birmingham last week overcame and triumphed at the expense of its closest rival, Pleasant Ridge.

It took a supreme effort in the boys' 200-meter (64-year total) relay, but Forest Hills proved equal to the occasion, winning the event in 1:54.9 and the meet, 194-185.

PLEASANT RIDGE, undefeated prior to the contest, thus became the 10th straight team to fall before the Birmingham contingent since the Northwest Suburban Swim League was formed last year.

Forest Hills swimmers won 16 of the 28 individual events and four of the six relays. In doing so, they broke 16 club records, five of which were in the relay events.

Individual record-breakers were Jane Wattles, 10, in the 25-breaststroke, 25:0; Jim Morgan, 10, in the 25-backstroke, 22:1; Lynn Cartwright, 14, in the 50-breaststroke, 46:1; Jeff Wallace, 16, in the 50-freestyle, 16:23; Doug Brooks, 13, in the 50-backstroke, 38:4; Cheryl Metcalfe, 13, in the 50-butterfly, 41:8; and Chuck Brooks, 15, in the 50-backstroke, 35:0.

OTHER WINNERS for the Birmingham club were Debbie Diester, 8; Rick Phillips, 8; Don Parrish, 12; Wood Lots, 15; Peggy Clark, 10; Curt Finney, 11; Sue Engle, 9; Dan Fishburn, 10; Dave Wattles, 13; Pete Wallace, 14; Mark Cameron, 15; and Jeff Straight, 17.

Today at 6:30 p.m. Forest Hills will host the Lathrup Village Swim Club.

According to Coach Hank Buick, the team has strong hopes of finishing the season with a perfect record and winning the league championship meet to be held Aug. 23-24 at the Forest Hills pool.

For the first time in the educational history of Michigan a summer workshop will be held by the Association of Directors of Physical Education and Athletics.

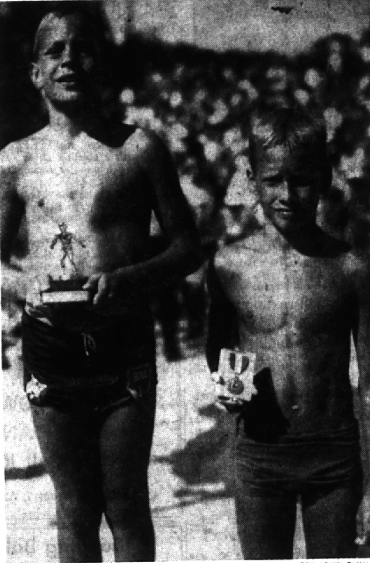
Frank Whitney, coordinator of physical education and athletics for the Birmingham school system, will serve as chairman of the workshop Aug. 16-18 at Camp Kett.

Birmingham's district Colt champions traveled to Bay City last Friday and returned on Saturday with the Colt League's sectional title.

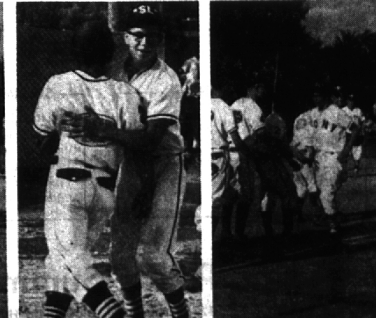

In a single game on Friday, Birmingham was the winner by a score of 1 to 0. The game was scoreless going into the bottom of the seventh inning when Dave Wolfe led off for Birmingham with a double to right field, helping himself considerably with an excellent fallaway slide into second to barely evade the tag.

BAC Splashes To Club Title

At Birmingham Athletic Club they start their swimmers young—say, three-and-a-half or four years old.

By the time the youngsters are eight or nine they are accomplished swimmers and are ready to start setting new records in their age groups.

The success of this philosophy was proved for the third year in a row Sunday when BAC swam away with the Suburban Interclub Swimming Association championship.

THE HOST CLUB scored 256 1/2 points and easily outdistanced the six other contenders for the crown. Birmingham Country Club, the runner-up, had 144 points. Forest Lake scored 60, Bloomfield Open Hunt 55, Orchard Lake 54 1/2, Pine Lake 51 and Meadowbrook 39.

The outcome was somewhat predictable Saturday when BAC qualified 40 individuals and six relay teams for the finals.

Of the 24 individual races, BAC placed first in 16 and swept the six relays.

RECORDS WERE smashed by BAC performers Sandy McMaster, in the 13-14 50-meter freestyle in 31.2 seconds; Mary Ann Bricker, 11-12, 50-meter freestyle in 33.7 seconds and 25-meter butterfly in 17.1 seconds; Tim Murphy, 9-10, 25-meter freestyle in 15.3 seconds and 25-meter butterfly in 17.1 seconds; and Nancy Nordlie, 9-10, 25-meter freestyle and 10-and-under 25-meter backstroke.

Tobin Role Jr. of Birmingham Country Club set meet records of 30.5 seconds in 11-12 50-meter freestyle and 17.7 seconds in the 25-meter backstroke.

Physical Exam Forms Available For LL Football

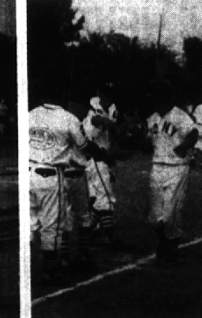
The little league football season is just around the corner.
