teams with an increase of an estimated 100 persons and six to seven more teams will participate next year.

"The organization previously grew in a period of six years from 100 youngsters and seven teams to more than 400 boys making up 27 teams in the season just ended," he said.

Anderson said the growth of the program has made it necessary to broaden the administrative - executive group of the league to include for the first time the election of vice presidents in charge of organization and of operations from among the officer board members elected by the team managers and coaches.

JOE T. Atkins, vice president of organization, of 3740 Burning Tree Drive, Bloomfield Hills, will supervise managers, coaches and administration.
