## Educators Confer At Cobo Hall

Gov. George W. Romney will be among the speakers addressing the joint meeting of the Michigan Association of School Administrators (MASA) and the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) at Cobo Hall, Sept. 11-12. MASA is an affiliate of the Michigan Education Association.

Dr. E. Dale Kennedy, executive secretary of the MEA, is the staff representative to the association.

Over 2,500 school board members, superintendents and college faculty from around the state will attend the meeting.

General sessions, business meetings, educational exhibits, luncheons and speeches will mean a full schedule for educators attending the two-day conference.

THE MEETING will be opened with an official welcome from Detroit Mayor Jerome Cavanaugh and William D. Morrifield, president of the Detroit Board of Education. Dr. Lynn M. Barlett, state superintendent of public instruction, will give the opening address.

Wednesday afternoon will be devoted to separate MASA and MASB meetings, but the two organizations will meet for a banquet that evening. Dr. Tompason Gayer, director of public relations for the Cooper Tire and Rubber Company, Findlay, Ohio, will address the group.

DR. OLE SAND, director of the National Education Association's Project on Instruction, and Dr. John E. Ivey Jr., dean of Michigan State University's College of Education, will be keynote speakers at general sessions to be held Wednesday and Thursday afternoons.

Gov. Romney will close the conference with an address late in the afternoon of September 12.

Small group discussions on such topics as team teaching, educational television and upgraded classrooms will be held between business and board meetings.

## Teachers Will Meet At Cobo Hall in Oct.

The general sessions of Regions 6 and 7 are being held in conjunction with Region 2. More than 18,000 teachers from Macomb, Wayne (exclusive of Detroit), Oakland and St. Clair counties will attend the Cobo Hall meeting. On Oct. 18 the teachers will return to their local areas for small group meetings.

## Unemployment Compensation Claims Rise

Model change layoffs boosted claims for unemployment compensation in South Oakland County during the month of July. The weekly totals of individuals filing claims in the Royal Oak branch of the Michigan Employment Security Commission are as follows:

Those filing claims numbered 1,547 for the week ending July 4; 1,717 for July 11; 1,879 for July 18; and 1,974 for the week ending July 25.

This increase in claims does not represent an increase in real unemployment since these individuals are still job-affiliated and will return to work within one to four weeks.

Demand for qualified workers continues strong in this area. Job placement by the Royal Oak branch of the Michigan State Employment Service totalled 610 in July. This compares with 580 in July of 1962.

Unfilled job openings at the local employment office last week totaled 242, the largest in the last several years.

Acute areas of shortage include the construction industry which needs 50 carpenters in addition to painters and electricians. The restaurant industry has vacancies for 63, including waitresses, hostesses, cooks and busboys.

Retail trade has openings for 180 salespersons, part-time, full-time male or female. Demand continues strong in manufacturing plants with openings for 54 skilled machine hands and 6 semi-skilled machine operators.

AGRONSKY, correspondent-analyst for "Today," NBC-TV, will discuss "World Crisis and the United States" at the Oct. 17 session. His speaking colleague, King, president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, will discuss "A World in Transition."

On Oct. 18 teachers from Oakland, Macomb and St. Clair counties will attend small group meetings presenting new teaching methods and techniques. They will be able to choose from over 20 topics ranging from aerospace and science to foreign languages to music.

## Civil Service Reports New Examinations

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced new examinations for recreation resource specialists (paying \$6,675 to \$14,565 a year) and public health educators (paying \$6,675 to \$12,845 a year) for work in Washington, D. C., and throughout the United States.

Recreation resource specialists are employed mainly in the Department of the Interior to provide technical advice and guidance to Federal, state and local governments in connection with outdoor recreation needs and resources. Related experience is required although appropriate education may be substituted for some of the experience.

Public health educators are employed chiefly in the Public Health Service of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare; they provide leadership in developing sound educational methods of solving health problems.
