

Timetable Set For Highway Construction

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie has announced a timetable for construction of 182 miles of Interstate freeway to be started between 1966 and 1969.

The projects, when built, will complete Michigan's 1,080-mile portion of the 41,000-mile National Interstate Highway System, Mackie said.

The projects will cost an estimated \$142 million, including engineering and right-of-way.

Michigan now has 948 miles of Interstate freeway open to traffic, under construction and in the en-

gineering and right-of-way acquisition stages, Mackie said.

THIS INCLUDES 635 miles open to traffic, 160 miles under construction and 153 miles in preliminary engineering and right-of-way stages.

Five of the seven projects will be built during the Highway Department's third five-year construction program which starts July 1, 1967.

Mackie said the Highway Department's office of planning is now developing a third five-year construction program and has given top priority to scheduling construction of the state's remaining Interstate mileage.

30 YEARS AGO

Aug. 17, 1932

"All of our remaining Interstate mileage must be put under contract by 1970 if it is to be open to traffic by 1972," Mackie said.

The Interstate Highway Act, passed by Congress in 1956, provides that the entire Interstate System will be open to traffic by the end of 1972.

"In order to meet the 1972 deadline, all preliminary engineering and right-of-way acquisition must be scheduled now if future construction is to proceed on schedule," Mackie said.

Marygrove College Seeks \$3 Million

Marygrove College will seek \$3 million from area individuals and businesses to complete its development program which includes a new laboratory building for the natural and physical sciences and for scientific child study.

Appointment of a committee of trustees to act for the depositors in liquidating the remaining assets of the closed First National Bank of Birmingham is proposed in a plan which has been submitted to Washington, D. C., for the approval of the comptroller of the currency, it was announced yesterday. The proposal, which, if carried out, will eliminate the need for a receivership, was first conceived at a meeting of about 12 of the bank's largest depositors and stockholders three weeks ago.

The list of families on the City of Birmingham's welfare rolls this week is shorter than it has ever been in the six months since the city took the welfare burden over from the townships, according to Gordon Van Camp, welfare investigator. Only 115 families are now listed, and of these only 90 are receiving grocery orders, and the others only partial relief.

15 YEARS AGO

Graceland, a 43-acre Troy township subdivision, a major portion of which is being placed under construction to terrace dwellings, is now a part of the City of Birmingham. Annexation was accomplished last Wednesday when the Troy Township board of Supervisors, having had the township attorney look into the manner in which the annexation would take place in the event of an election, reconsidered a previous denial action and approved the awarding of the large development to Birmingham.

As a further measure to provide more efficient fire fighting service, D. P. Frame, supervisor of Southfield Township, announces that the township board has employed Alfred W. Kruck as chief of the Southfield Fire Department. Hereafter the volunteer firemen have elected one of their members each year to act as chief.

Taxpayer Numbers Reported Promptly To Revenue Service

R. L. Nixon, Detroit district director of Internal Revenue Service, reported that nationwide the service estimates that more than 60 percent of depositors contacted by savings and loan associations furnished their taxpayer account numbers within a short time of being asked. For most people, the taxpayer account number is the same as the social security number.

Recent laws passed by Congress require banks, savings and loan associations, corporations and other payers of interest and dividends to obtain the taxpayer account number from each depositor and shareholder.

The numbers are to be used in reporting to Internal Revenue interest or dividend payments of \$10 or more.

ACCOUNT NUMBERS are needed in processing tax returns under Internal Revenue's automatic data processing system. With more than 2 million taxpayers named William Smith and many thousands of other Smiths, Jones, Browns, etc., the numbering system is necessary to insure proper crediting of each taxpayer's account.

Internal Revenue's estimate is based on a survey conducted by the Society of Savings and Loan Controllers, an affiliate of the United States Savings and Loan League.

Nixon further stated that the deadline for reporting taxpayer account numbers is September 30, 1963.

CEF Holds Convention

The fourth annual convention of Citizens for Educational Freedom was held at the Park Shelton Hotel, Detroit, on Aug. 9-10. Birmingham residents attending the convention were Mr. and Mrs. James Kennedy.

The convention considered such items as the advisability of early court tests to determine the rights of nonpublic school parents under the equal protection clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, the current course of Federal Aid to Education proposals and the effect on public schools when nonpublic school parents receive equitable treatment in the dispensing of educational taxes.

Oakland County May Be Single Court District

Oakland County may become one of the nine districts of a state appellate court created by the new state constitution.

If the recommendations of a committee headed by Sen. Farrell E. Roberts, R-Oakland County, are adopted by the State Legislature,

the Oakland County District may become a reality.

OAKLAND COUNTY would be the smallest district if the plan is adopted. The estimated population of Oakland County is 750,000, which is about 130,000 less than the average for nine districts.

Roberts' committee's proposal would make Pontiac the headquarters for the three-district suburban division and the Oakland County district.
