In the junior club championship at Birmingham Country Club, the 17-year-old Groves High senior carried a 72-74-73 for 26 holes to successfully defend his crown.

Bill, of 31767 Lahser Road, Beverly Hills, is captain of the Falcons' football and basketball squads.

HIS BIGGEST competition came, surprisingly, from a boy four years his younger, Bradley Host, son of Mr. and Mrs. Norris A. Host, 18935 Bedford, shot a sensational 72 in the morning round to tie Stephenson for the lead.

Although slipping to an 81 later, Brad, a freshman at Cranbrook school, captured the runner-up slot.

In the girls' junior division, Cathy Bronson, 17, of Bloomfield Township, won the tournament with a 139-total for 18 holes. Gini Dubois was the runner-up.

IN OTHER boys' divisions, Jeff Matson and Ed Watkins finished 1-2 for 14-year-olds; Tom Fortuna edged Dave Nick for 12-13 year-olds, and for boys 11 and under, Tom Lodish was the winner while Dave Leonard finished second.

For junior girls, Cathy Fitzgerald won the 14-15 age bracket, Sherry Brewer captured the 12-13 year-olds with Pat Bronson the runner-up, and Robin Rote was the 11 and under winner. Patty Rider finished second.

In the last meet—Water Wonderland at Brennan Pools—Maple Swim Club boys' team finished fourth and the girls' squad fifth. The meet was won by Patton Pool of Detroit.

An outstanding effort was made by Jim McGraw, who set a state record in the 50-meter freestyle for boys 10 and under, finishing with a time of 32.6 seconds.

JIM ALSO was a member of a 200-meter medley relay team that set another state record of 2:52.1. Other members of the team were Rich Phillips, Steve Wyatt and Kevin Trimmer.

Joanne Frew set a state record of 43.8 seconds in the 50-meter breaststroke for girls 10 and under with a time of 48.8 and swam on the second place medley relay. Water Wonderland attracted over 1600 individual entries from five states.
