

The Community House Offers Fall Courses

The Community House announced today that 27 cultural, craft, and hobby courses will be offered in its fall class schedule that begins on Sept. 16.

According to Karl Emmanuel Jr., director of educational activities, one new course is being offered area residents who will receive one of the 20,000 brochures that are being mailed out Monday.

The new course is crewel embroidery, an old English type of embroidery that is done with yarn instead of thread. The instructor, Mrs. Jeanne Jacobson, has studied with Erica Wilson, considered an expert in the field.

The FALL courses range from 6 to 15 weeks in duration and cost from \$2 to \$32. Registration will begin on Tuesday, Sept. 3, at The Community House, 380 S. Bates. Course fees must be paid in full at the time of registration. An additional charge of \$1.50 will be required of those students who do not have a Birmingham-Bloomfield Hills post office address.

COURSES available include art appreciation; bridge (beginning, intermediate, continuation and duplicate); creative pottery; dancing (for adults); exercise (for women); first aid; flower arrangement; home accessories workshop (a do-it-yourself program; interior decorating).

Military: painting (oils and watercolor); rapid reading; sewing and tailoring; seamanship; silversmithing (including goldsmithing, enameling and casting); ballet (classes for all age groups); and language classes in French, Russian and Spanish.

Braille transcribing will also be offered again this fall.



Gossett Named To Commission On Civil Rights

William T. Gossett, 58, of 420 Goodhue, Bloomfield Hills, was named Tuesday by Gov. George Romney to the eight-member Michigan Civil Rights Commission.

Gossett is a retired vice president of Ford Motor Co. and a special consultant to President John F. Kennedy on international trade.

He is a Republican member of the bipartisan commission which allows only four members of any single party.

The new commission will meet officially early in September. It was created by the new State Constitution and will achieve legal status effective with the Constitution Jan. 1.

Hills Commission Rejects Mayor's Plan Board Choice

For the second time in as many months, the Bloomfield Hills City Commission today night rejected an appointment to the planning commission by Mayor Lyman J. Craig.

Three commissioners, James J. Beresford, David W. Lee and Louis J. Colombo, Jr., refused to go along with Mayor Craig's appointment of Mrs. Paul M. McKinney.

Mrs. McKinney, sister of Senon E. Knudsen, general manager of General Motors' Chevrolet division, was to fill the vacancy on the city planning commission created when Dean Draper's term expired last month.

MAYOR CRAIG in July recommended Robert A. Frye to the position, only to have the city commission reject that suggestion.

Colombo said that he disagreed with the appointment because he did not think any changes should be made in light of study on the proposed new zoning ordinance.

"I think any changes in the planning commission right now would be a mistake. We need the advice and counsel of the present members," he said.

A RECOMMENDATION by Johnson that all district teachers receive permanent continuing contracts after a three-year probationary period was not acted upon. It also was a part of the teachers' requests.

Board members asked that legal opinion be submitted as to how continuing contracts would differ from permanent teacher tenure before they made their decision. Board member Max Miller suggested that a renegable of the present contracts renewable at the end of each year might be substituted.

Fringe benefits adopted by the board include 10 days a year sick leave, accumulative up to 100 days.

A YEAR'S leave of absence at half salary would be made available at the end of each five-year period of teaching in the district. Only two per cent of the total number of teachers in the district could take leaves in any one year.

At present, this would allow five teachers a year to be on leave. Cost to the district would be close to \$17,500.

Teachers would have to use leaves for a specified endeavor approved by the superintendent.

ALTHOUGH THE BOARD went on record approving the policy, it did not make it official until a study is made as to its legality under state law which allows the granting of such leaves every seven years.

Although it was not a part of the teacher's salary committee request, the Hills school board agreed to raise in athletic coaches' salaries. The director of athletics will receive an additional \$600. Coaches will get an additional \$100 for each sport coached. The supplemental salaries will cost a total of \$3,000.

Commissioner Henry L. Woolfenden echoed the mayor's words.

"THE ONLY BASIS on which a responsible commissioner could turn a mayor's appointment down is for lack of qualification," Woolfenden demanded.

Colombo said that he was not challenging Mrs. McKinney's qualifications, but disagreed with the appointment only because of the present issue at hand.

"I'm not backbiting anyone, but it is not the appropriate time for an appointment," Colombo said.

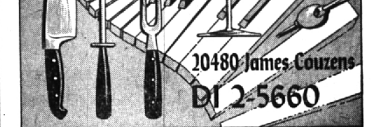

S'field Man Held for Trial

Norton Silvers, 38, of Livonia, has been ordered to stand trial in Detroit Recorder's Court on charges of rapping a six-year-old girl and leaving her in a Southfield field on Aug. 7.

Recorder's Judge Gerald W. Groat bound Silvers over Tuesday after he was identified by his victim. He was ordered held in the Wayne County Jail after he was unable to post the \$50,000 bond.

Silvers is accused of stopping the girl as she rode a bicycle near her Detroit home, forcing her into his car and driving to a field near Greenfield and Nine Mile Road where the attack took place.

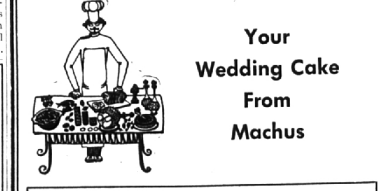
