## B'ham Attracts People From Different Areas

(Special to the Eccentric) NEW YORK—Birmingham may boast that a comparatively large proportion of its population consists of people who gave up their residence in other areas of the country to settle there. No less than 8,168 people, representing 38.4 per cent of the city's American-born population, came from some other state.

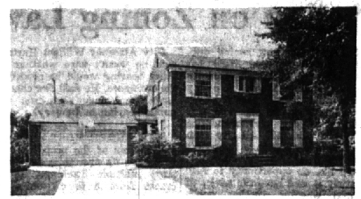
The influx, locally, was greater than that recorded in most localities. Elsewhere in the United States, by contrast, only 28.4 per cent have moved from other states to the ones in which they are now living. In the East North Central States 23.9 per cent have made such moves.

The findings are from a report just released by the Department of Commerce, based on data gathered during the last census.

THE PURPOSE of the study was to get some idea of the extent of internal migration in the United States.

That the American people, as a whole, are constantly on the move is something that was well known. What had not been established previously was just how great are the shifts and swings of population, from state to state and from community to community.

## Civil Defense Course Offered

The Birmingham and Oakland County offices of Civil Defense have announced that they will sponsor a free, two-hour course in disaster preparedness for all persons in the Birmingham area.

The course, which will be presented in cooperation with the Birmingham Public Schools, will start on Wednesday, Sept. 18, at 8 p.m. at Pembroke School. Starting with lessons in first aid, the course will proceed into areas normally reserved for doctors and trained medical personnel, according to John Saeffe, Birmingham administrative aide in charge of civil defense.

TOPICS TO be covered include psychological warfare, contagion or isolation techniques, radiation and fallout decontamination and psychological first aid. No pre-registration is necessary, Saeffe said. Registrations will be accepted at the school on Sept. 18.
