## Two B'ham Men Pronounce Vows At Colombiere

Two Jesuit seminarians from Birmingham will pronounce perpetual vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience today in the community chapel at Colombiere College, Clarkston, the novitiate for the Detroit province of the Society of Jesus.

Rev. Ara. F. Walker, S.J., Colombiere seminary rector, will receive the vows which, taken after a two year novitiate, are a step toward the Roman Catholic priesthood in the Society of Jesus.

**THE TWO** are James Farrell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Farrell, 3636 Tuckahoe, Birmingham, and Sidley Sullivan, son of Mrs. Hazel Sullivan, 4126 Webster, Birmingham.

Both men attended Quarten Elementary School and Barium and Derby Junior High Schools. Farrell then went on to graduate from U. of D High School while Sullivan is a graduate of Seehorn High School.

**DURING** the past year each of these seminarians has spent two weeks assisting Marg. Kern at Most Holy Trinity parish in Detroit and has worked for a month at St. Joseph's Hospital in Flint.

These young men, continuing their thirteen years of training for the priesthood, will spend two more years at Colombiere College studying the classics and humanities.

Then they will go to West Baden College, West Baden, Ind., for three years of philosophy.

**NEXT WILL COME** three years of teaching in one of the Jesuit high schools of the Detroit province, which includes Michigan and most of Ohio.

Finally, they will return to West Baden College for four years of theology with ordination to the priesthood following the third year.

## Pastor Will Tell About Cowboy Camp

Dr. W. Glen Harris, pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Birmingham, will report Sunday on his experiences at the July Cowboy Camp Meetings in New Mexico, using as his sermon theme, "The Gospel According to a Cowboy."

Dr. Harris left Birmingham on July 13 and preached the next day to several Spanish speaking congregations at Santa Fe.

The following week he domed his cowboy boots and preached twice each day at the Cowboy Camp Meetings at Nogal Mesa, N.M., and the following week at the Cowboy Camp Meetings held at Montosa Peak, N.M.

**WHILE ATTENDING** these meetings, Dr. Harris found himself in his native element, having been born in Texas and living there until he left to attend the seminary at Princeton, N. J. He lived, camped out and served on the kitchen crew with the cowboys.

The Cowboy Camp Meetings are a part of the program of the Board of National Missions of the United Presbyterian Church. Dr. Harris also participated in this program in the summer of 1958 and was invited to return this year.

Boys and girls from the Junior and Chapel Choirs attend camp for a week of rehearsals in preparation for the coming year.

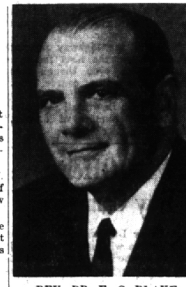
Other camp activities such as swimming, horseback riding and boating are included in the daily routine so that the children enjoy a well-rounded week of fun and work.
