

Michigan Shoreline Tour

Ever consider Michigan's shore-line for a touring summer vacation? Here are 2,254 miles of scenic frontier along which the vacationer may find as many different moods as suit his fancy. Perhaps a small portion of his long coastline will be enough; there is too much to see in a single summer-time. Choose Lake Huron for the

sea-sort of sunrises that come to the east or Lake Superior for moody unpredictability and violent wild nature. Where people travel to the towns, hamlets, and cities of this coastal empire. Where wilderness is needed, we are still lucky to have unhighwayed expanse along our Superior Shore.

To find solitude there, the traveler must leave his car and use Shank's Mare or Aluminum Canoe. Michigan's many islands also offer coastal opportunities. Take your pick and find a beach to poke along. The sun is sunnier, the air is airier, and the memory of such a trip will linger longer.

Old Flame to New

Firm a handle in a too-large holder by burning down an old candle stub—or a half-inch from the bottom of the new one—in the holder. Next, press the heat-softened bottom of the new candle firmly down on the still-burning stub. The candle will then adhere to its new holder-fitting base.

Remove Rust; Wax

The best way to remove rust from outside metal fixtures is with plain steel wool dipped in kerosene. Then polish with liquid wax.

Make Ironing

An Easy Task

If you want to make ironing easier, you have to start before you get to the ironing board.

Over-drying clothes in a dryer, for example, puts in deep wrinkles. So does over-loading the dryer. And so does leaving the clothes in the dryer after they are "done". These wrinkles mean you'll have a more difficult ironing job to do.

"IRONING MADE EASY," a folder written by Lucile Ketchum, home management specialist at Michigan State University, offers a number of ideas on ways to make ironing easier and more satisfactory.

She points out that fabric softeners, permanent starches and some of the newer convenience starches may save you time during the ironing process.

She also notes that when you buy clothing, you can choose items with wrinkle-resistant, soil-resistant or embossed finishes that cut down on ironing. And some fabrics, such as seersucker, corduroy, terry cloth and nylon, need little or no ironing.

A special theater for the troupe near the familiar Kiddie Barnyard will seat 500 children, according to Walter A. Goodman, State Fair general manager.

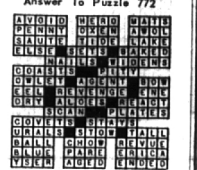

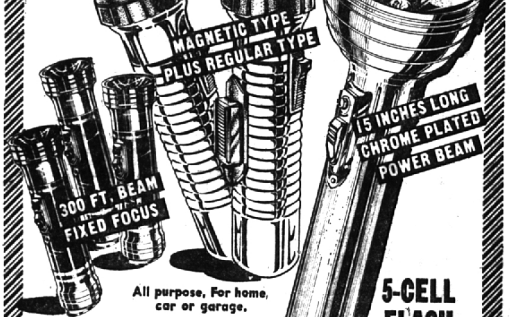
