Steve Stubbs won the title for the first time by defeating Pete Whitelaw, 1 up, in the 36-hole final Sunday.

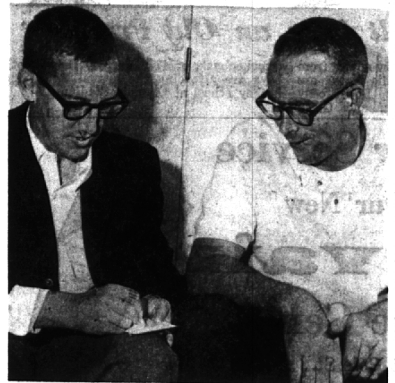
In the women's division, Mrs. Robert E. Leahy won her fourth championship by defeating defending champ, Mrs. William L. Mosher, 1 up.

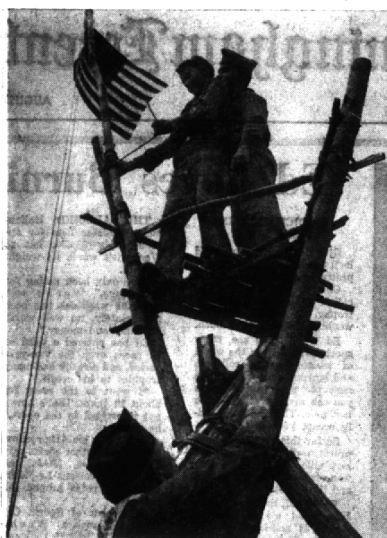

Prizes and trophies will be awarded to the top finishers in each event. Sandy Bishop, assistant pro at Northwood, will be in charge of the tournament.

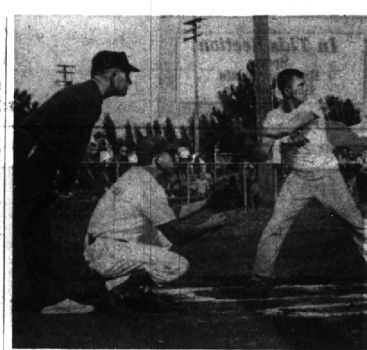
Babe Ruth Tryouts Scheduled Aug. 31
