George Roeper, headmaster of City and Country School of Bloomfield Hills, has announced the appointment of six new members to the faculty for the academic year 1963-64.

Mrs. Alicia Mackie of Birmingham, B. A., M. F. A., Cranbrook Academy of Art, will be the instructor for the regular art program in grades one through eight. She will also conduct the art clubs which are designed to provide an opportunity for students of the school who have a particular interest or talent in art to work more intensively in the field.

DURING THE past summer Mrs. Mackie was one of 30 teachers from all over the United States and Canada to attend a Creative Art Education Workshop on Long Island, N.Y., sponsored by the Museum of Modern Art and conducted by Victor D'Amico, director of the Department of Education of the Museum of Modern Art and his staff.

Christopher Flynn will be the instructor for the drama clubs. He is at present the director of the Children's Workshop program at the Vanguard Playhouse in Detroit where he has been for the past three years.

After studying for three years at Harvard University where he was majoring in psychology, he turned to the professional stage in Boston and later in New York.

During this time his experience included, besides acting, work with the American Ballet Theatre and teaching for the Robert Joffrey Ballet.

REPLACING Richard Youngs, who was given a grant by Michigan State University where he will study for his Ph.D. degree,

Alan H. McGowan of Brooklyn, N.Y., has been appointed as science instructor for the upper school, grades four through eight.

Men and women dress alike in many countries. In China they wear trousers and similar shirts; in other areas, they wear the same kind of robes.

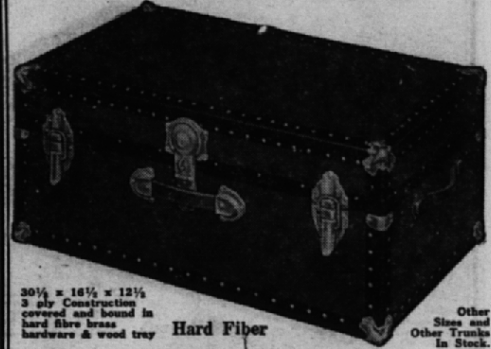
### New Evening Wear
