50,000 See Tut Treasures At Art Museum

College Credit Classes Scheduled at Oakland

Oakland University will offer three courses for credit in the evening this fall for persons who wish to take college work.

They are introductory courses in Western literature and social psychology and an upper-level course in economics and business. Four courses will be offered in the winter semester and two in the spring.

There will be three sections in Western literature. One will meet from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Monday and Wednesday. The second section will meet from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Tuesday and the third at the same time Thursday.

STUDENTS who take either the Tuesday or the Thursday section must also attend special one-hour lectures at 6:30 p.m. Monday and Wednesday.

Introduction to social psychology will be 8:30 to 10:20 p.m. Monday and Wednesday.

The economics course is accounting and statistical techniques and will be offered from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Wednesday. It is open only to students who have had introductory economics.

Classes will begin the week of Sept. 9. Registration and fee payment will be in Room 161, North Foundation Hall, from 6 to 8:30 p.m. the first evening of each class meeting.

In the winter semester, Western institutions will be added to the list. In the spring semester, Western institutions and economics and business will be offered.

Water Supply Bonds Okayed For Township

The Michigan Municipal Finance Commission has approved \$2,120,000 of water supply bonds for Oakland County for the Bloomfield Township system, according to Attorney General Frank J. Kelley, chairman.

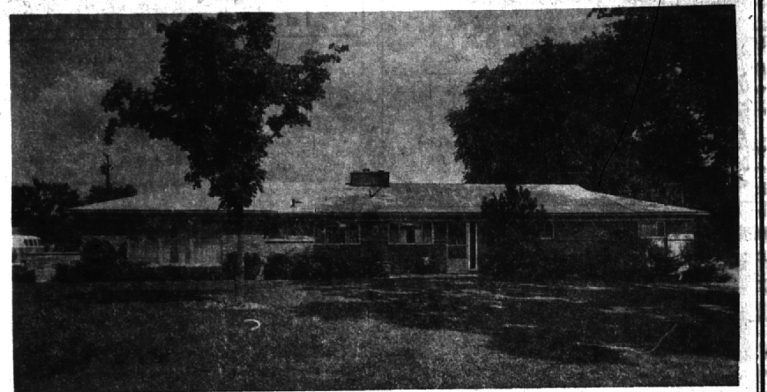
"The proceeds will be used to acquire the Oakland County water supply system for Bloomfield Township, consisting of existing wells, pumping facilities now owned or operated by the township and also water supply mains, pumping facilities and storage facilities," Kelley said.

The bonds will be issued under a contract between Oakland County and Bloomfield Township, whereby the township agrees to pay the county an amount each year to pay the principal and interest requirements of the bonds.

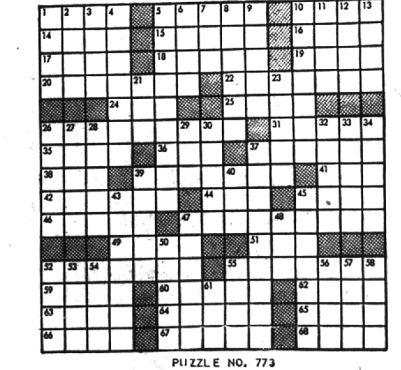

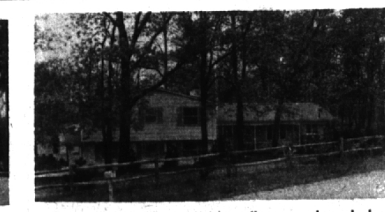

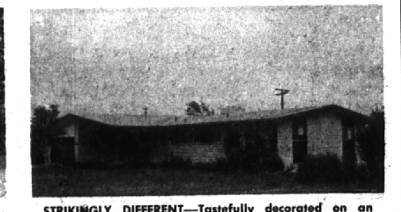
