

### Broomfield Soon To Announce His District Choice

Cong. William S. Broomfield is expected to announce shortly which of the two new congressional districts he will run for office from in 1964.

His decision will probably be made public Sept. 20 at the dinner welcoming up the Party's Neighbor-

to-Neighbor campaign fund drive.

CONG. BROOMFIELD will select either the 18th District, which has been reduced and now includes cities in the Townships of Royal Oak, Southfield, Troy and Bloomfield, or the newly created 19th district, which includes the rest of Oakland and all of Livingston County.

The 18th has been termed a "swing" district, which might favor the Democrats or Republicans, while the 19th is heavily Republican.

## Atlantis Society Sets Meeting for Monday

Birmingham's newest cultural organization, the Atlantis Society, will hold its next meeting Monday night at The Raven Gallery.

The group, which is made up of 160 Birmingham area families, has been in existence for about three months but has only been incorporated for a month.

Atlantis has offered to lease one old home in the block south of Shain Park and develop it as an office building for nonprofit organizations.

The City has been trying to obtain the 100-year-old home at the corner of Townsend and Bates for part of the new municipal parking lot.

AT THE present time, the City and the property owner have not been able to reach a purchase agreement. Commissioners have tabled without date a proposed condemnation resolution on the property and two other adjacent homes.

The society believes the home at 288 Townsend should be kept as an historic building that would "help preserve the charm of the city."
