Redeemer Lutheran to Open Midweek School of Religion

A new phase of an expanded education program, called the "Midweek School of Religion," will open Tuesday at Redeemer Lutheran Church, 1800 W. Maple, Birmingham.

The course of study of the school is designed to fit into the traditional philosophy of Christian education developed by the pastoral staff of the congregation.

Such illustrated lessons, say church officials, will also help the children visualize what they are learning as something having happened in a real country, that will excite and still follow many of the same customs today as in Christ's day.

Under the guidance and direction of the Revs. Theo. and Duane T. Wuggazer, the congregation's father-and-son team ministry, this program will afford extended training in Christian education to children from grades three to eight.

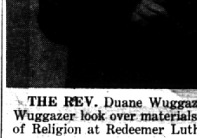
THE TWO categories have been labeled Doctrinal and Practical. First, according to church officials, children in the third grade already need a deeper and more enriched study of Bible teachings as related to their life; in this way they will become better informed children of God ready to take their place in contemporary life.

IN ORDER to accomplish objectives in both these departments, two 45-minute class periods of religious instruction are woven into the evening's activities, each with its own instructor specifically trained in one field of learning.

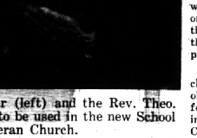
SUPPORTED by the congregation, the program expects to reach an enrollment of 175 to 200 students this fall. Ten lay people, all but two being trained teachers, and the congregation's two pastors will serve as instructors.

Two church directors and one superintendent complete the staff of 13 full-time workers.

AT 5 P.M., school convenes in church with a 15-minute opening worship designed to increase the child's reverence and his appreciation of the opportunity for worship.
