Bill Has Implications For Real Estate Firms

"The new income tax reduction bill has tremendous implications for the real estate industry," Ben Martha W. Griffiths of the 17th district told members of the Western Wayne-Oakland County Board of Realtors at their luncheon meeting last Thursday.

Under the bill, which Mrs. Griffiths, a member of the House Ways and Means Committee, predicted will soon be enacted into law, so-called "real estate tax shelters" would dwindle sharply, since they would lose the preferential treatment they enjoy at present, Mrs. Griffiths said.

"On the other hand, true capital asset gains in real estate will benefit from a reduction from the present tax range of 10-to-25 per cent to a new tax range of 5.2-to-21 per cent," she predicted.

Losses, Congresswoman Griffiths said.

THE PROVISION that allows individuals 65 or over to exempt from tax the gain attributable to \$20,000 of the sale price of a personal residence, should prove a boost to the real estate industry, she declared.

Mrs. Griffiths was introduced by Paul L. Fisher, vice president and program chairman of the Western Wayne-Oakland County Board of Realtors.

Her address was the first of a series of talks on public issues arranged by Fisher for the board's weekly luncheons this fall and winter.

SECRETS OF SHOOTING ACTION

Even with a simple box-type camera you can shoot action shots that will be full of fun and excitement. Here are several tricks that will help you get the best results.

* For objects that are moving in one direction—like a sled, car, boat, or plane—try moving your camera right along with the action so the main subject stays in your viewfinder. Then press the button. The picture should come out fine, although the background may be fuzzy. But that just adds to the feeling of action.

* For snapping people in action it's better to have the action coming toward you. If the kids are walking, skating, or playing a game, get into a position where they are moving toward you. Then hold the camera steady and gently press the button.
