

Musical Trio Gives Concert In Southfield

A musical evening featuring Detroit musicians Joseph and Helen Kertesz and Jess Forstot will be presented at Northwest Unitarian-Universalist Church, 23625 Northwestern Highway, Southfield, at 8 p.m., Sept. 22.

The program includes Beethoven's "Trio in D Major" (called the Ghost Symphony); Franck's "Sonata for Violin and Piano" and Arseny's "Trio in D Minor".

Kertesz, an accomplished violinist, has been associated with the Detroit Board of Education in the field of music for 14 years and is orchestra instructor at Mumford High School.

MRS. KERTESZ is organist and coach for the string quartet at Henry Ford High School. The Kerteszses live in Ferndale.

The cello player, Forstot, is a

former Detroit Symphony man, and currently plays in the Fisher Theater orchestra. The three have played together for 15 years.

HEADING THE committee in charge of arrangements for the event is Edward Siebert of Detroit. Assisting are Miss Janet Kimball, Mrs. Ted Hiltchcock and Mrs. Thomas Sitwell—all of Detroit—and George Stoughton of Rochester.

BRIDGE in BIRMINGHAM

Many of you who play rubber bridge but have not entered a duplicate tournament have an experience awaiting you. This weekend, starting tonight and continuing afternoon and evening through Sunday, we will have our Southern Michigan Bridge Association Sectional Tournament at the Army in Pontiac.

If you will attend, I will find you a "kibitzer's chair" at no charge, so you may determine if you would care for the game. If you will accept this invitation, you will ask to play, and may do so upon the payment of the entry fee, but there will be no obligation to be anything but a "kibitzer."

FOR YOU that play in the tournament we will provide gala entertainment. We will have a cocktail party Thursday evening and another one between sessions on Friday.

On Saturday we will provide a dinner between sessions and on Sunday we will have a continental breakfast starting at 11 a.m. All this for no charge other than the usual entry fee.

FOR YOU WHO play rubber bridge, we have a very interesting hand that was played recently. I duplicate the bidding. There have been different and the play of the hand could have been changed. Neither side vulnerable; West is dealer.

WEST (dealer)	EAST
▲ A 10 7 4 3	▲ Q
♥ void	♥ J 7 4 2
♦ 4	♦ 7 3
▼ A J 8 7 4 3 2	▼ K Q 10 9 6 5

The bidding:
WEST NORTH EAST SOUTH
Pass Pass 3 ♠ Dble
5 ♠ 5 ♠ 6 ♠ Dble
Pass Pass 7 ♠ Dble
All pass

This was the actual bidding of the hand, but I would have preferred an opening bid by West, but had West passed, I believe East should have also passed. The North and South hands are omitted so that you may place yourself as the declarer and take your choice of the play.

The opening lead was the King of Hearts which was ruffed in the dummy and the declarer crossed over to the closed hand with a trump. Next the queen of spades was led.

Declarer stated after the hand was over that had North failed to play the king, he would have let it ride; however, North did cover.

AS THE CARDS were distributed, North held the king of spades and three small ones and South held the jack and two others. Via the cross-ruff, declarer was able to get rid of his two diamonds on the 10 of spades and the 10th spade, and did make the contract.

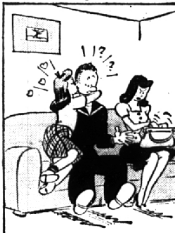
Had this hand been played at duplicate, West may have doubled the six diamond bid and obtained 500 points for at least an average board. Then in the play of the hand, the declarer may have settled for a one trick set, feeling that if he took a chance to make the contract and it failed that he may have a bottom board and kill his chances to win the tournament.
