ORDINANCE NO. 73 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 11, KNOWN AS THE "DOG ORDINANCE".

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 11, known as the "Dog Ordinance", be and the same hereby is amended by the addition thereto of a new section thereto known as Section 11, reading as follows:

Section 11.01. Kennel License Required. No person shall own or operate any dog kennel in the Village of Beverly Hills, without having first secured a license therefor. For the purposes of this ordinance, a kennel shall be construed as an establishment wherein or whereon any person keeps three (3) or more dogs, six (6) months old or older, regardless of whether any remuneration is received therefor. No such kennel shall be operated in any district within the Village specified as a residential district under the terms of the Zoning Ordinance.

Section 11.02. Application for License. Any person who shall keep or operate a kennel shall, in lieu of the individual license required under this ordinance, make application to the Village Clerk or his authorized agent and the village Clerk or his authorized agent of the village Clerk or his authorized agent as a kennel. Such application shall also state the purpose for which said kennel is to be maintained, and shall have attached thereto an inspection certificate signed by the Public Health Officer of the Village, is authorized representative, stating that the kennel to be covered by the license complies with the sanitary requirements of the Commissioner of Agriculture for the State of Michigan regarding kennels and that the dogs therein are properly fed and protected from exposure commersurate with the red of the dog. This inspection shall be made not more than Thirty (30) days before filing the application for license. The application may also contain such other information as may be requested by the Village Clerk.

Section 11.03. License Fees, License fees for kennel

Section 11.03. License Fees. License fees for kennel license shall be \$15.00 annually plus \$1.50 for each dog in excess of ten (10) dogs. A kennel license issued under the terms of this ordinance shall be valid and operative for a term beginning January 1st in the calendar year for which such license is issued, and terminating on the last day of December in the same year.

Section 11.04. Issuance of Kennel License. Upon receipt of such application, the inspection certificate and the license fees herein provided, the Village Clerk shall issue a kennel license, setting forth the maximum number of dogs which may be kept thereunder, and at the same time shall issue to the applicant a number of suitable tags equal to the number of dogs authorized by such license, such tags to be the same as those herein otherwise provided. Any dog in such kennel at any time, shall jat-all times wear a collar or harness to which said tag shall be used fixed, and such tags shall be used for no dogs other than those in said kennel.

other than those in sain kennel. Dogs in kennels shall not be taken therefrom for any purpose, mless the same have been properly immunized as provided in this ordinance. Where dogs in kennels have been properly immunized and have a kennel kave been properly immunized and have a kennel kave been may be taken outside the limits of the kennel temporarily, and in leash, transportated in closed conveyances temporarily for purposes of breeding, trial, show or sale.

Section 2.01. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall become effective immediately upon publication.
