the slate roof it was removed in a wide area around the spot where Mrs. Bramley was trapped.

"THE ROOF" boards were removed with a chain saw and great care was taken to make sure the roof rafters were not disturbed," he said.

At this time Mrs. Bramley was about three feet below the rescue. The workers were able to see she was in a head down position with her feet about three feet above her head.

"She could only move her right arm," Nunneley said, but was unable to place it over her face to protect herself from falling debris.

HE SAID a large beam was on Mrs. Bramley's right foot but workers were able to lift it slightly and free the foot.

About 45 minutes before she was pulled from the rubble a doctor administered a sedative, Nunneley said.

The hole through which Mrs. Bramley was finally removed was 15 by 36 inches. Nunneley had great praise for the rescue unit.

"It's a wonderful piece of equipment," he said. "There was nothing we needed that wasn't on the truck."

ALONG with Nunneley, Birmingham firemen who took part in the rescue were Lt. William McTigue, Len Garlitz and Doug Smith. The Frubauf explosion was the first one of its kind the Birmingham Fire Department had been involved in since 1949 when an antique shop was destroyed on N. Woodward and fireman Lee Carroll was killed.

THE TYPE of rescue operation that was used to free Mrs. Bramley is included in the free class in disaster preparedness that is being offered by the city of Birmingham and the Oakland County Office of Civil Defense.

Registrations for the class are still being accepted on Wednesday nights at the Pembroke School.

Notes: Plant in well drained humusy soil. Enrich soil with bonemeal. The spring flower is in the bulb now, with adequate food. If ground is dry give ONE thorough watering after planting. DO NOT mulch until ground is frozen to about 2 inches deep. Mice are apt to nest in mulch if applied too soon. Dark colors will not show well when far from the house. Clumps of one color seem more showy than mixtures. Colors may be stronger if they are in filtered sun at noon. Most bulbs (except Tulips) should be planted as soon as possible. Fertilizing with 4-12-4, or some such, should be done early spring. Be sure to water well during hot dry periods before bloom time.
