### Society Offers Cards to Help The Handicapped

The Detroit Society for Crippled Children is offering season's greeting cards to help the area handicapped children.

Mrs. Charles Ewald, 18674 Chilton, Birmingham, is the volunteer handling sales in this area.

The cards, compiled by Jeanette Southart, are being offered through doctors' offices, schools and other organizations. They may also be ordered directly through Mrs. Ewald.

THE PROCEEDS from the cards go directly to the Detroit Society for Crippled Children to provide care and treatment for the handicapped children under the society's program.

This program includes physical therapy, speech therapy, occupational therapy, bracing and appliances, nursery schooling, summer camping and all services received by a handicapped child to learn to live as nearly a normal life as his physical limitations will allow.

### School Bus Drivers Are Familiar Faces

Children who ride buses to school will likely find a familiar face in the driver's seat.

Erwin Hendershott, director of bus transportation for Oakland Schools, said the number of new bus drivers this September is half what it has been in any previous year.

Hendershott, who directs a series of training courses for new bus drivers in Oakland County School districts, said 41 drivers completed the basic training courses offered in August. He expects about 25 new drivers to enroll in a second course starting Wednesday and running through Nov. 6. Last year there were 125 new drivers to be trained.

"In the last two years, more emphasis has been placed on the selection and training of qualified people," Hendershott said. "Bus driving is part-time work, and the pay is not high. People who are accepting bus driver positions and are attending classes are dedicated to the job."

To keep up the interest of bus drivers in their work, Hendershott has arranged four courses for them during the fall school semester. One course titled "Emergencies and Responses" was inaugurated last year at the request of bus drivers.

It will be offered in Bloomfield Hills, Novi, Pontiac and Rochester. A four-session course on human relations will be presented at Troy, Brandon, Clarkston and Lyon.

"THE PSYCHOLOGY of Safety" will be offered in classes held in Southfield, Huron Valley and Waterford. A fourth course, titled "Defensive Driving," is slated in Birmingham, Farmington and Oxford.

The classes are not limited to drivers in the districts in which they are held, Hendershott emphasized. They are scheduled in different locations only to make it convenient for bus drivers to attend.

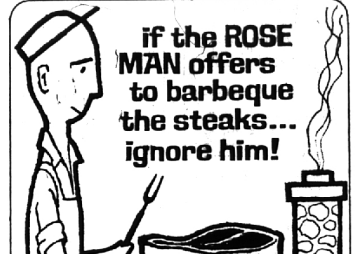
