# Chamber Notes

William E. Roberts, a leader in many activities that give him "across the board" contact with phases of civic interest that make up the "work to be done," holds the job of president of the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce. The chamber is spearheaded by a man of action whose community activities have given him the experience necessary to fulfill the obligations of his position.

The City's legal advertisement stated that 94 feet of the northerly portion of a street would be vacated. The ad should have read 119.98 feet, according to City Manager L. R. Gare.

A new hearing was set for Oct. 7. On Aug. 12 the commission had declared no necessity for setting up a special assessment district for extending the street to the north because only two property owners were involved.

HE HAS BEEN RE-ELECTED three times to the city commission. His interest in the YMCA began in 1955 when he was appointed building chairman and at present is the newly appointed chairman of the YMCA.

He shall, at the annual meeting of the Chamber and at such other times as he may deem proper, commend to the membership of the board of directors such matters and make such suggestions as may tend to promote the prosperity and increase the usefulness of the Chamber.

WITH MEN the caliber of Bill Roberts at the helm of the chamber of commerce it is not difficult to understand why the men and women of the community give so generously of their time and effort to fulfill the obligations given to them to keep the area the wonderful place it is.

Determining the projects and activities that will best carry out the objects of the chamber of commerce requires the combined judgment of many forward-looking citizens.
