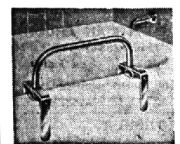

Autumn Arrives Monday

Monday marks the official opening of autumn. With the close of summer at 1:24 p.m. Monday, nights will steadily grow longer, reminds University of Michigan astronomer Hazel M. Loh. "Since June 21 the sun has been moving southward, and on the day of the equinox it will cross the equator," Professor Loh explains. "On this date, the sun will rise and set almost exactly at the east and west points, and the day and night will be said to be of equal lengths." BUT THIS is not strictly true. The U.M. astronomer points out. "Although the sun will be above and below the horizon for equal lengths of time, it will appear to be above the horizon longer than below." The reason is that as the sunlight reaches the earth's atmosphere it passes through a dense region and the light becomes bent or it appears to be "lifted." This atmospheric effect lengthens the day by as much as 10 minutes, Professor Loh notes. The day and night will appear equal on Sept. 26, and from then on the day will continually grow shorter.

Police Attend Sessions About Youth Problems

Area police officers will be among those attending three hours per week for the next month in the classroom in a special basic in-service training program sponsored by the Delinquency Control Training Center of Wayne State University. Sgt. Charles Blashfield will represent the Birmingham Police Department. Participants from the Village of Beverly Hills Police Department are Sgt. Thomas Good, Sgt. Frederick Bielman and Patrolman Peter Lutz. THE PURPOSE of the sessions is to help police officers do a better job in their contact with youth. Early sessions will deal with the strategy and general principles governing police contact with youth as well as investigation and interrogation where youth are involved. Dealing with youth gangs will also be discussed, as will juvenile court procedures and provision of juvenile code as to apprehension and detention of juveniles.
