"Traveling on Life's Highway" was the topic chosen by Mrs. Helep Baugh for her lecture at the September Christian Women's Club luncheon at Devon Gables, Bloomfield Hills.

Mrs. Baugh, of Kansas City, Mo., is the national president and founder of the organization.

In telling of its origin, purpose and growth she reported that there are now 300 clubs in the United States, with a total of 40,000 to 45,000 women attending the monthly luncheon meetings.

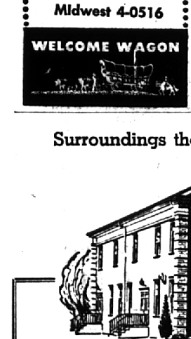

Area Church To Dedicate New Windows

On Sunday, First Presbyterian Church of Birmingham will dedicate the new memorial faceted glass clerestory sanctuary windows at the morning services.

The themes of the windows are "I, Christ, Shall All Be Made Alive," "By Faith, Abraham Offered Up Isaac," "As Moses Lifted Up the Serpent," "Restores Unto Me Joy of Thy Salvation," "I Shall Come to Pass," "Go Ye Into All the World," and "And They Were Filled with the Holy Ghost."

"And the Word Became Flesh," "Ponder Me," "He Taught Them, Saying," "Truly, This Was the Day that the Lord Raised Up the Resurrection and the Life."

This type of glass is first used when Byzantine mosaic artists used thick colored glass and instead of embedding the glass in stone, pierced the walls clear through and set it in as window lights.

With the coming of thinner sheet glass and advent of the glazier's craft, more refined work supplanted the more crude form.

The technique crossed the Atlantic in 1939 and was used in the Christ, 3737 W. Big Beaver Road, at the Shrine of the Most Blessed of Beauce at Quebec. Panels were featured at the French pavilion at the New York World's Fair the same year.

With the end of the war, faceted glass took on new life as rebuilding began in Europe and a long period of new construction let loose in the United States.
